

Privacy Act Statement. Under contract with Mr. Tatanaki, I undertook the task of attempting to normalize relations between the United States and Libya by engaging in liaison activities with various officials in the United States Government. I advised Mr. Tatanaki on U.S. and UN political requirements to meet UN resolutions that have imposed sanctions on Libya. I introduced him to American legal counsel and Legislative and Administrative personnel who also stressed compliance with UN resolutions. I accompanied him on a trip to Tripoli and met with government ministers to further stress compliance with U.S. and UN sanctions.



Memorandum of Understanding

Albert Grasselli, David Bowen, and John M. Murphy (GBM) agree to undertake the task of attempting to normalize the relations between the United States of America and Libya. In order to accomplish this mission the GBM group will liaison with the officials in the United States to include The U.S. Congress, The Executive Branches of government; specifically, The Defense Department, State Department, Central Intelligence Agency, and the National Security Council. The GBM group will further undertake to portray the image of Libya and it's administration in a most favorable view with the U.S. and world media, as well as the entire U.S. population. The GBM Group will insure that all required U.S. Government regulation requirements are met. The GBM Group will further use its best efforts to arrange a meeting and a visit to Libya by U.S. officials for the purpose of observing specific areas to be designated by the U.S. Group. Libyan officials will cooperate with arranging this visit which is to take place as soon as possible. The GBM Group will invite national news media groups to visit Libya for the purpose of observing all aspects of Libyan culture and life. These media visits will have the cooperation of the Libyan Government.

The GBM Group will utilize Mr. Hassan Tatanaki as the liaison person for all relations and coordinations with the above named mission.






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AGREEMENT

1. Reference: Memorandum of Understanding dated 26 March, 1992 between Hassan Tatanaki, Albert Grasselli, David Bowen, and John M. Murphy attached hereto and part of this agreement.
2. Hassan Tatanaki will compensate the GBM Group for their best efforts to accomplish the mission. Hassan Tatanaki will pay a retainer fee of four hundred and fifty thousand U.S. dollars to the GBM Group. Hassan Tatanaki will further pay the GBM Group two hundred and twenty five thousand U.S. dollars per month, paid monthly in advance, for expenses in the U.S. in furtherance of the mission. Extraordinary advertising campaigns and delegation trips to Libya, and other foreign areas in furtherance of the mission, will be billed separate.
3. Reports: The GBM Group will report in writing on the last calendar day of each month to Hassan Tatanaki, or his designee, detailing their activities in furtherance of the mission.
4. Special Reports: The GBM Group will communicate directly with Hassan Tatanaki, or his designee, by telephone, telex, or facsimile on a frequent basis to inform him of the results of important conferences, meetings, and contacts related to this mission.
5. Special Expenses: Where Hassan Tatanaki requests special services not included in paragraph 2, above such as: retaining special counsel to provide specific legal services or extraordinary experts for specific purposes, these expenses will be paid by Hassan Tatanaki after consultation with the GBM Group.
6. Timing: This agreement is in effect on date of signing. The office of record is stated above. Payment should be made upon the execution of this document.
7. Termination: This agreement shall be in effect for one year. This agreement may be terminated by either party with ninety days written notice, one to the other, after ninety days duration. This agreement may be extended after one year upon mutual agreement of the parties.
