Answer to Question No. 11

A. Toyota Motor Corporate Services of North America, Inc.  
(TMCS)

Activities conducted during this period have included: following the status of revisions to the Global Climate Change Action Plan particularly with regard to the use of alternative fuels in motor vehicles or increases in fuel economy; assisting TMCS with respect to questions arising from the implementation of the Clean Air Act Amendments; assisting Toyota's U.S. manufacturing facilities regarding environmental permits and advising them of the impact of regulations proposed or promulgated by EPA under the Clean Air Act on these facilities; assisting TMCS determine the implications of EPA's approval of a petition by the states comprising the Ozone Transport Commission regarding the use of California vehicles in those states; follow developments of White House Advisory Committee on Reduction of greenhouse gasses from personal motor vehicles; following the status of legislation to reauthorize the Resource Conservation and Recovery Act and Clean Water Act; following the status of the Lead Reduction Act of 1994; participation in a study of the impacts of transportation on environmental quality and energy consumption sponsored by the Consumers Energy Council of America; preparation of oral and written reports to the foreign principal on the status of the above bills and regulatory activities; preparation of the semi-annual report under the Foreign Agent Registration Act; preparation of quarterly statements under the Federal Regulation of Lobbying Act; advice on interpretation of existing vehicle emission and safety regulations.

B. Royal Thai Government

During this period, services provided included: general review of the status of the U.S.-Thailand issues; monitoring U.S.-Thailand bilateral textile negotiations; review of potential Thai chicken imports to the United States, including discussions with Department of Agriculture Officials; monitor 1995 farm bill; monitoring general trade issues; and periodic reports to clients on the above issues.
