I will provide written commentary on draft agreements for negotiations. Then, it is anticipated that I will discuss the commentary by telephone with the foreign principal. It is expected that I will meet the representatives of the foreign principal to discuss commentary and provide advice regarding conduct of actual negotiations with USA. I will be compensated at the rate of \$75/hour, for initially 40 hours of work. Expenses will be paid by the foreign principal. I will work with Mr. James Rowles.

The activities include research, analysis, written work product, and discussions with the foreign principal. The majority of the research will be based on sources in Harvard libraries. Discussions with the foreign principal will take place by phone, and possibly thru meetings.

Dear Minister Bohrt:

Following your suggestion in our telephone conversation of today, I would like to propose the following arrangements and fees for providing legal advice during the first stage of the negotiations relating to the treaty in question.

Ms. Christine Cervenak and I shall review the draft of the treaty which the group under your supervision is preparing, and shall provide a report in English containing written commentary and suggestions for your consideration. It is anticipated that your group will have finished its draft by the end of next week, and that we would have received a copy on or about Monday, February 15. Thereafter, we would expect to send our report to you sometime during the week of February 22 and in any event by Friday, February 26. At that point we would be available for a telephone conference call to discuss the report.

Either as an alternative or in addition to the conference call, if you prefer, one or both of us might travel to Washington or La Paz to discuss with you our report and the negotiations relating to the treaty. Compensation for such travel would be as mutually agreed, and in addition to that proposed here. Also, after presentation of the draft text to the other government, we would be available to assist you further in the second stage of the negotiations, in accordance with such terms as might be mutually agreed.

With respect to the honoraria or fee arrangements, I propose that Ms. Cervenak and I each work five eight-hour days, billed at the rate of \$75 per hour for Ms. Cervenak (40 x \$75 = \$3,000) and \$150 per hour for myself (40 x \$150 = \$6,000). The total cost for our work would be \$9,000, plus actual expenses for telephone, courier, etc.

In short we undertake to do the work for \$9,000 plus incidental expenses. We would bill you for no more than eight hours a day or a total of 40 hours each, even if we have to work additional hours to complete the report. If we work fewer than 40 hours each, we will bill you only for the hours worked.

Also, if you need a Spanish translation of our report, I could arrange for one to be prepared (at an additional cost of U.S.\$0.12 per word), and would personally review the translation.

If this arrangement is satisfactory to you, once we have your agreement we shall immediately begin preliminary work so as to be in a position, after receiving your draft, to complete our report by the week of February 22. Should you wish to discuss these arrangements further, we would be happy to do so.

We look forward to working with you and your team on this matter.



Dear Mr. Ambassador:
