**GOODBYE NELSON ROLIHLAHLA MANDELA**

The Ethiopian People's Revolutionary Party (EPRP) sends its condolences to the families of Nelson "Madiba" Mandela and the people of South Africa for the passing away the great leader.

For us, Nelson Mandela exemplified courage and perseverance, a humane and democratic vision, tenacity and pan Africanism, reconciliation and loyalty to his cause for which he had said from the start he was ready to die. Mandela passed 27 hard years in prison (18 of them in the notorious Robben's Island) but never gave up his fight, he did not knuckle under apartheid regime despite all that cruel system tried to break his will and stain his soul. A man of immense courage, Mandela, as he often said, joined millions of other South Africans, leaders of his generation, the martyrs of Umkhonto weSizwe (MK), the PAC, the Steve Bikos and youngsters who resisted apartheid and brought its downfall. It is to be remembered that the Western powers backed and supported apartheid and Mandela was also called a terrorist and condemned by most of them till the tide turned.

The leaders and members of the Ethiopian Student Movement who later became part and parcel of the EPRP grew up with the struggle of South Africa, demonstrating against apartheid and Ian Smith's "Rhodesia" UDI. The regime at the time forbade such demonstrations at the same time as it brought Mandela for military training in Ethiopia. The official relations of the EPRP with the ANC/PAC, ZANU/ZAPU, SWAPO, PAIGC, FRELIMO, MPLA etc. were forged in the early seventies especially in Algiers. The EPRP has never ceased to express its solidarity to the struggle of the South Africans even when it did not see eye to eye with the ANC on ideological and alliance matters. And yet, Mandela was an African figure for all and for all that time. He remained a man of humility and principle even after becoming president, condemning the invasion of Iraq, the sad plight of the people in the Niger Delta, the murder of Ken Saro-Wiwa, and standing firmly for justice and democracy and more.

Nelson Mandela joined the ANC in the early forties (the ANC was established in 1912), was arrested and jailed in 1956 on treason charges. We remember the

Sharpeville massacre that eventually led to the Soweto uprising and the eventual release of Mandela himself and his becoming president by 1994. A long and arduous struggle that called for immense individual sacrifice and Mandela, along with the people of South Africa, endured it and came out victorious. Present day South Africa with its serious social, economic and political difficulties, with its xenophobia against Africans (Ethiopians included), with workers' protests and killings, corruption and crime can hopefully learn from and cherish the wisdom of Nelson Mandela to be a beacon of democracy and pan Africanism. ## **RADIO AND INTERNET ACCES STILL DENIED IN ETHIOPIA**

The regime in Ethiopia has once again resorted to deception by declaring that no jamming of opposition radio stations and web sites exist. A recent such argument by a high government official has reportedly pointed to the fact that one previously jammed TV and radio station is freely accessible in Ethiopia.

Though it is true that those with satellite dishes can watch the previously banned TV station which has been unjammed now, it is absolutely false that the restrictions against other radio stations and web sites have been lifted. Access to the internet and radio stations remains denied. Thus very many web sites (like Debteraw, Assimba, Ethiolion, EPRP.com, Socepp (a human rights organization), etc. are not accessible for reasons that are termed security and stability concerns by the regime itself. Radio stations like Finote Democracy have been jammed for the last five years at least. The regime in Addis Abeba has thus contravened its own Constitution and international laws on freedom of expression, speech, of the media and more.

Censorship is officially inexistent in Ethiopia but the regime has imposed stifling censorship in other ways:

1. It owns most of the printing houses;
2. It threatens publishers willing to print books critical of the regime;
3. If such books get published it sends its security agents to go to book stores and distributors to threaten them to drop/reject that particular book.

And yet some critical books do manage to appear. However, several writers, poets and journalists' are blacklisted by the regime. This is the reality.

That is why the EPRP, whose web site and radio are restricted, calls on all international advocates of human rights to raise their voices against this repressive action. Britain, the USA and all others who back the repressive regime in various ways are expected to raise their voices to condemn the jamming and censorship actions of the regime in Addis Abeba.

## THE AMHARA PEOPLE FACING DANGER OF GENOCIDE

An evil campaign has been fired up in Ethiopia, by the regime in place and other extremist elements, to provoke violence and the mass slaughter of Amharas, considered by the TPLF/EPRDF regime and its supporters as the main enemy as a people. Inside the country and in the Diaspora, crazed extremist elements have been mobilized to call for the massacre of Amharas and some of these elements have even been guests of Western TV stations and radio programs given the chance to spread their propaganda of hatred.

The concern for the fate of the Amhara people is not an unjustified fear of the worst. The background of the regime in place clearly confirms that the catastrophe that looms is not an illusion. The ruling Tigray People's Liberation Front (or the EPRDF as it likes to be called now) defined its struggle back in 1975 as "anti-Amhara", the major ethnic group in Ethiopia next to the Oromos. Long before it took power in 1991, the Tigrean front now in power collaborated with the Eritrean front (EPLF) and the Oromo front (OLF) to attack Assossa in Wollega and to cause the massacre of hundreds of Amharas there. The Eritrean commander of the operation has proudly narrated in an interview how they "dealt" with the Amharas there. Some three hundred Amharas were killed, burnt alive and/or slaughtered. Video evidence of the horrible massacre is available. The alliance of the Tigrean front, the Oromo front and the Eritrean front or regime has always been stringently anti-Amhara and by extension anti-Ethiopia. These elements have for long equated being an Amhara with being for Ethiopia and as they consciously stood and still stand against Ethiopian identity they consider Amharas as the main enemy. Hence the conscious anti-Amhara campaign.

Once the TPLF took power using the name EPRDF as a cover, it let loose anti-Amhara elements to commit massacres of Amaharas in ARBAGUGU (the man who ordered the mass killings, Hassan Ali, is now a refugee in the USA if not an American citizen already. The OLF, led by Lencho Letta then (he now lives in Norway) undertook the brutal killings of Amharas in BEDENO in the East. Pregnant women were bayoneted, seniors and adults thrown down the cliff—carnage is the word to describe it. In Eastern Wollega too, the OLF has been involved in the murder of innocent Amharas. The extremist Oromiya Islamiya

group has also been accused of the murder of nuns and monks in the Asebot monastery. The anti-Amhara campaign, which has now been reactivated, alleges that back in history Emperor Menelik and his troops has killed Oromos. The fanning of hatred and spirit of vengeance invokes dubious history to criminalize Amharas a hundred years later and to prepare genocide. A shameful monument to keep hatred and revenge alive has been inaugurated by the regime's officials. Even during the recent demonstration by students in Ambo extremists were heard shouting anti Amhara slogans. The regime in power has condoned and even fanned the ethnic cleansing of Amharas from various southern regions and even from Ambo town. Amharas are defenseless and victims of the State sponsored and backed campaign to kill or oust them from the lands they had lived in for centuries.

A feeling of impending doom has gripped all Amharas and Ethiopians who do believe in the unity of the country. Note should also be taken that the anti-Amhara campaign is being assisted by foreign elements and media who reecho false history and try to accuse Amharas as a people of being anti-Oromo. Ethiopian unity and sovereignty has always been challenged by foreign forces (the Napier expedition of the British, Mussolini's colonization attempt, etc.) who had tried to pit the people against one another. The fact remains that the present regime is based on ethnic domination of all Ethiopians including Amharas, Oromos, Somalis, Gurages, Anuaks ...etc. It has committed massacres in Gambella, the Ogaden, Sidama and other places too. But the threat against the Amharas has increased and is being aided by diaspora extremist elements who benefit from the American or British systems to call for the "slitting the throats" of all Amharas.

The danger is real and all the more serious because the ruling regime is also wobbling and trying to use the anti-Amhara campaign to gain support during the 2007 general "election".

The EPRP calls on the Amhara people and pan Ethiopian forces to defend themselves and condemns vigorously the ethnic cleansing, hatred and killings directed (and being prepared) against the Amhara people.

The EPRP also calls in earnest all Ethiopians, inside the country or abroad, to stand together against such divisive and hatred campaigns of the regime and extremist elements and foil all plans of ethnic cleansing – as they have shown their unity in front of such historical occasions.
