The Registrant performed services for P/C Advisors Inc., a Delaware corporation based in the United States ("P/C Advisors"). P/C Advisors performed services directly for the Office of the President of Ukraine (the "Foreign Principal").

The services performed by the Registrant for P/C Advisors consisted principally of legal advice related to the Freedom For Russia and Emerging Eurasian Democracies and Open Markets Support Act of 1992 (the "Freedom Support Act"), various foreign assistance programs for Commonwealth of Independent States ("CIS") republics, and foreign assistance authorization and appropriation legislation related to the CIS. This included conducting legal research, preparing analyses and memoranda and reviewing proposed legislation. The Registrant also performed limited political activities as described in question 12 below.

These activities were terminated as of October 31, 1993.

<sup>1</sup>The term "foreign principal" includes, in addition to those defined in section 1(b) of the Act, an individual or organization any of whose activities are directly or indirectly supervised, directed, controlled, financed, or subsidized in whole or in major part by a foreign government, foreign political party, foreign organization or foreign individual. The Registrant performed the services described below for P/C Advisors as part of P/C Advisors' broader activities performed for the Office of the President of Ukraine.

In addition to the services described in question 11 above, the Registrant performed a limited number of political activities. These involved assisting in planning a visit by two Ukrainian officials to Washington, DC (which visit was ultimately cancelled) and participation in activities conducted by the Freedom Support Coalition.

The Registrant assisted P/C Advisors and a lobbying firm retained by P/C Advisors to plan a trip to Washington, DC by Valentin Simonenko, Chairman of the Social and Economic Council of Ukraine, and Victor Ivchenko, Chief Administrator of the Office of the President of Ukraine, to be conducted during September 7th-12th, 1993. This visit was ultimately cancelled. As part of the Registrant's efforts, an attorney of the Registrant law firm sent two letters to the Honorable Kenneth Brody, President of the Export-Import Bank of the United States. These letters are attached as Exhibits 1 and 2.

In addition, attorneys of the Registrant firm attended a number of meetings conducted by the Freedom Support Coalition. The purpose of these meetings was to build support for enactment of legislation to authorize foreign assistance for the CIS. A number of U.S. government officials were present at such meetings as described in Exhibit 3. In all instances, the purpose of the contacts was to discuss the prospects for F.Y. 1994 foreign assistance authorization and appropriation legislation in Congress, as embodied in H.R. 2333 and H.R. 2295 and companion bills in the Senate. A detailed description of such meetings is set forth in Exhibit 3.

Dear Mr. Brody:

Our law firm is registered with the U.S. Department of Justice to represent the Government of Ukraine in Washington, D.C.

On September 8th through 11th Mr. Valentin Simonenko, the Chief Advisor to the President of Ukraine, and Victor Ivchenko, the Chief Administrator of the Office of the President of Ukraine, will be visiting Washington, D.C. I would like to request a brief introductory meeting among Messrs. Simonenko, Ivchenko and you.

His Excellency Valentin Simonenko, in addition to serving as the top advisor to President Kravchuk, also serves as the liaison between the President and the Cabinet of Ministers as well as Chairman of the Social and Economic Council of Ukraine. The Social and Economic Council is one of the key organizations spearheading the dramatic political and economic reforms which are currently underway in Ukraine. Mr. Simonenko was formerly Mayor of the City of Odesa (three terms) and Governor of the State of Odesa. His Excellency Victor Ivchenko is the Chief Administrator of the Office of the President of Ukraine and the top assistant to Mr. Simonenko.

We envision the meeting to be short and informal, and to be conducted on a date convenient to you during the period of September 8th through 10th. The purpose of the meeting would be simply to establish a personal relationship among Messrs. Simonenko, Ivchenko and yourself. We hope that this introductory meeting could be followed up soon by more substantive meetings to address the issue of possible Eximbank financing for Ukraine.



Dear Mr. Brody:


