The nature and method of performance of the attorney contract between the registrant and the foreign principal are to engage in the legal representation of and advocacy for the foreign principal as is necessary to assure that a proposed bill for special jurisdiction in the Court of Federal Claims is fully considered by the Congress.

5. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

Registrant proposes to help the foreign principal obtain the enactment of a special jurisdictional bill in Congress which would authorize jurisdiction in the Court of Federal Claims to hear the claims for damages against the United States arising out of treaties concluded by the Pottawatomie Nation and the United States. To achieve this, registrant will: (1) facilitate meetings between the foreign principal and Congressional Members and Committees, other Indian tribes and organizations, and the Canadian Embassy; (2) advocate for the introduction and passage of the bill; (3) attend Congressional hearings concerning this bill; and (4) provide background information and technical assistance to Members of Congress and others on the nature of the foreign principal's claims against the United States.

At the present time, there are several procedural and jurisdictional barriers in federal law which prevent the foreign principal from litigating its claims for damages against the U.S. on the merits. The political activities will be directed at drafting, seeking the introduction of, and lobbying for enactment of federal legislation permitting the foreign principal to bring, and the federal court to entertain, the foreign principal's damages claims.

**SPECIAL COUNSEL ATTORNEY CONTRACT
BETWEEN
THE KEEWATINOSAGIGANING POTTAWATOMI
AND
THE NATIVE AMERICAN RIGHTS FUND**

1. This agreement is made and entered into by and between the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi and the Native American Rights Fund (hereinafter "NARF"), a non-profit law firm located at 1506 Broadway, Boulder, Colorado 80302.
2. The Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi, under authority conferred by resolution of the Executive Council, which is attached hereto and made a part hereof, hereby contract with, retains and employs the Native American Rights Fund and such other attorneys as are employed by it (hereinafter "attorneys").
3. It shall be the duty of the attorneys to act as special counsel for and on behalf of the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi in seeking legislation and appropriations and/or litigation for wrongful deprivation of certain annuities and payments due them under treaties concluded by the Pottawatomi Nation and the United States.
4. The attorneys, in the performance of the duties required of them under this contract, shall be subject to the supervision and direction of the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi Executive Council and shall regularly report to and consult with the Executive Council.
5. In consideration of the services to be rendered, NARF shall be compensated at the rate of \$85.00 per hour, and reimbursed for all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses for the services provided under this agreement. Compensation and reimbursement of fees and expenses shall be contingent on the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi receiving Congressional appropriations and/or court awards.
6. No assignment of the obligations of this contract, in whole or in part, shall be made, nor shall any assignment or encumbrance be made of any obligation of the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi to provide compensation and reimburse expenses.
7. This contract may be terminated by either party by giving thirty days written notice to the other party.
8. The attorneys shall make to the Executive Council a written report of the services rendered to the Executive Council no less frequently than semi-annually and at such other times as may be requested by the Executive Council.

Dear Mr. Williams:

The purpose of this letter is to terminate the contract entered into between the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi and the Native American Rights Fund (NARF) in September 1989 (copy attached), wherein NARF was retained to act as special counsel to seek legislation and appropriations and/or litigation for wrongful deprivation of certain annuities and payments due to the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi under treaties concluded between the Pottawatomi Nation and the United States. The terms of the attorney contract provide that in consideration of services rendered, NARF will be reimbursed at the rate of \$85 per hour and reimbursed for all reasonable out-of-pocket expenses, and that such compensation and expenses will be contingent upon the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi receiving Congressional appropriations and/or court awards.

It is NARF's intent not to seek reimbursement from the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi for attorney services previously rendered, or for any of the out-of-pocket expenses NARF may have incurred which have not already been reimbursed.

However, NARF is still willing to serve as special counsel to the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi, free of charge, in seeking legislation in Congress that would permit you to bring, and the U.S. federal courts to entertain, the claims for damages which you believe the United States owes under treaties concluded between the United States and the Pottawatomi Nation. If the Keewatinosagiganing Pottawatomi desire to engage NARF for this purpose and under these terms, it will be necessary for NARF to register as an agent of a foreign principal under the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938 prior to pursuing this matter in Congress on your behalf.
