 No written agreement and no explicit agreement exists between registrant and foreign principal. An informal understanding exists to the effect that if registrant succeeds in raising funds for Dr. Castejón's efforts, a small percentage of those funds will be turned back to registrant either to finance registrant's continued efforts on Dr Castejón's behalf to compensate registrant for work on behalf of Dr Castejón. An informal understanding also exists to the effect that if Dr Castejón reaches office, registrant will be called on to provide further advice and support in the enterprise of governing Guatemala.


