

Privacy Act Statement. 

Response to Question 4

R. Thompson and Company was retained on April 10, 1995, by the Government of Guatemala through the Ministry of Defense to brief on an ongoing basis officials of the U.S. government, the U.S. Congress, media, and interest groups regarding the current efforts and future plans of the present Guatemalan government to reform Guatemala's politics, economy, trade relations, and human rights. The purpose of this project is to assure that all interested U.S. officials and observers are aware of the steps that the De Leon government is taking to reform Guatemala.

R. Thompson and Company has been allocated a budget with which to perform this work. The budget will cover R. Thompson and Company's fees and expenses. In addition, the budget will cover all fees and expenses incurred by R. Thompson and Company to assemble a team of regional experts, consultants, and lawyers with whom to perform this work. The agreement extends for six months, with the possibility of three additional six month extensions, for a total potential duration of two years.

The method of performance of this agreement is described in Response to Question 5, below.

Response to Question 5

R. Thompson and Company was retained on April 10, 1995, by the Government of Guatemala through the Ministry of Defense to brief on an ongoing basis officials of the U.S. government, the U.S. Congress, media, and interest groups regarding the current efforts and future plans of the present Guatemalan government to reform Guatemala's politics, economy, trade relations, and human rights. The purpose of this project is to assure that all interested U.S. officials and observers are aware of the steps that the De Leon government is taking to reform Guatemala.

Neither R. Thompson and Company nor any member of the U.S. team of representatives it is assembling will engage in any activities relating to any specific incident of human rights abuse.

R. Thompson and Company will coordinate the efforts of a team of consultants, lawyers and advisers to provide these services. This U.S. team of representatives will conduct research into issues relating to Guatemala's reform efforts and U.S.-Guatemala relations; coordinate with and advise the Government of Guatemala regarding those issues; disseminate press releases, white papers and other documents regarding Guatemala and ongoing developments; and from time to time brief officials of the U.S. government, U.S. Congress, interest groups and the media on Guatemala's reform efforts and ongoing developments. 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representatives, may contact, by letter, telephone call, in person, or otherwise, officials of the U.S. government, the U.S. Congress, interest groups, and the media.

R. Thompson and Company will report to the President of Guatemala and to the Minister of Defense, directly and through their respective staff. R. Thompson and Company's primary point of contact with the Guatemalan government will be through a member of the President's staff who serves as the President's representative to the Presidential Human Rights Commission (COPREDEH).

Dear Mr. Minister:

It was a great pleasure for me and my colleagues to meet with you in Guatemala City on Friday, April 7, 1995. Our discussions have given us a very good sense of how to accurately and honestly explain the position of the Government of Guatemala and the Armed Forces of Guatemala in the current political climate. We fully understand the wishes of President Ramiro Carpio de León and you to ensure that the U.S. Congress, the Executive Branch and the U.S. media appreciate your Government's current record on human rights and your commitment to continued improvement in that area. We also understand the importance of the peace initiative your Government has underway with the URNG and that this will, in the near future, assure the final investigations and resolutions of previous alleged violations.


It would be our intention to open additional lines of communication in the United States with both your critics and your supporters so that your Government's story and the truth are fully explained. This will likely include visits to Guatemala by U.S. Government officials and visits to Washington, D.C. by senior Guatemalan Government officials. It will be our job to see that Guatemala's side of various issues is fully and correctly explained in the United States. Of course to accomplish that we need 100% cooperation from your Government and 100% access to required information...and we accept your earlier assurances of that.

If you agree with the above, we would like to begin to assist Guatemala on April 10, 1995. We propose a 6 month agreement with three 6 month renewal options (at 50,000 per month thereafter) on the agreement of both parties. For the first 6 months we would require a monthly retainer of \$70,000 plus expenses with the first three months paid upon the signing of this document by Your Excellency. The second three months can be paid on the 4th month of our agreement (August 10, 1995). Out-of-pocket expenses (travel, hotels, meals, phone, faxes, etc.) that are appropriate and approved, will be paid by the Ministry of Defense upon submission.

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
We look forward to working with the President of the Republic, with you and with the other Cabinet officers to improve relations, understanding, trade and economic benefits between our two countries.
