ENGAGEMENT LETTER FOR ADVOCACY SERVICES

JWI undertakes to provide advocacy services on behalf of the government of Cote d'Ivoire in Washington D.C. and in any other place the government so designates and to which JWI agrees. These advocacy services will be designed to enhance Cote d'Ivoire's image and reputation in government and private American circles to assure that the government's goals and objectives vis a vis the United States are brought to the attention of key decision makers and institutions which affect foreign and commercial policies. JWI will bend every effort to assure success of the government's goals through the implementation of the scope of work which has been separately agreed upon.

In summary, JWI will use its contacts in the executive, legislative and judicial branches of the U.S. government, as well as with the media, commercial organizations, think tanks, NGOs and other influential bodies including certain financial institutions located in Washington. We will pay particular attention to the attitudes of human rights organizations in this post conflict era. JWI will also, when requested, organize visits of senior Ivorian officials to the United States, as well as reciprocal visits of American officials to the Ivory Coast. All of JWI's efforts will be undertaken in close coordination with the Ivorian Embassies in Washington D.C and in New York, as is common practice in such advocacy contracts.

If, in the course of such advocacy work, the government of Cote d'Ivoire desires additional, specialized services such as significant media placements, JWI will help select and manage these sub-contracts for an agreed management fee.


