Dear Sir:

The European Atomic Energy Commission has decided to retain Messrs. Cleary, Gottlieb, Friendly and Hall to serve as legal advisors on questions of United States law beginning as of June 1, 1959.

As counsel for the Commission, your firm will undertake to provide such advice and assistance as the Commission may require, in connection with its activities in the United States and will keep the Commission currently advised of political and legal developments that may affect its interests.

As compensation for these services your firm will receive a regular retainer of \$500 a month payable quarterly. This retainer is to cover any work of ordinary character performed by the officers of your firm in Washington, New York, Brussels or Paris. In the event that your firm may be asked to undertake specific assignments requiring work of an extraordinarily intensive character or of extraordinarily long duration, it is understood that a separate fee will be agreed upon.

In addition to the regular retainer, Cleary, Gottlieb, Friendly and Hall will bill separately all out-of-pocket expenses for travel, telephone charges, etc. normally incurred in connection with the firm's services.

The arrangement outlined in this letter may be terminated by either party at any time. At the conclusion of each year either party, in consideration of the amount of work done and the results accomplished, may suggest to the other that the retainer thereafter be adjusted upward or downward.

We take it for granted that, where a conflict of interests might occur between the Commission and a prospective client, you will decline to act on behalf of such prospective client.

Would you please advise if this arrangement is acceptable to your firm.
