## **CONTRACT FOR THE PROVISION OF REPRESENTATION SERVICES BETWEEN THE GOVERNMENT OF THE REPUBLIC OF EQUATORIAL GUINEA AND C/R INTERNATIONAL L.L.C FROM THE UNITED STATES OF AMERICA**

The Government of the Republic of Equatorial Guinea, hereafter referred to as the Client, to be represented by Rev. Micha Ondo Bile, Minister of Foreign Affairs, International Cooperation and Francophonie\* (association of French Speaking Countries), and C/R International, hereafter referred to as the Consultant,

In their desire to cooperate and promote the establishment of a service agreement that will benefit both and

Encouraged by the strengthening of the excellent relations that fortunately exist between both parties, decide to enter into the following contract and agree to the following:

- The Consultant will provide the Client with strategic advice and support in its government and public relations as well as act as consultant for the promotion of US investments in the sister Republic of Equatorial Guinea.
- The Consultant will provide the Client with advice and support in its relations with the Executive and Legislative branches in the US, including among other services representation vis-à-vis members of the House and Senate as well as high officials in the White House and US administration; promotion of visits among government representatives in both countries; promotion of visits by members of the House and Senate and high officials in the US administration to Equatorial Guinea; preparation of white books, regular reports and other material for the dissemination of the positive aspects of the reality in Equatorial Guinea for the American and International Public Opinion.

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- The Consultant will also provide the Client with advice and support vis-à-vis international and US media, including among others the scheduling of interviews and informative meetings for members of the government of Equatorial Guinea, the preparation of press releases and other media activities.
- The Consultant will implement a public relations and media campaign including an attractive website showing Equatorial Guinea as an emerging, stable nation, that is also a viable economic partner and offers a good environment for long term entrepreneurial investments.
- The Consultant will hold daily contact and interaction at the highest level of the US government (including the White House, State Department, the Pentagon and Congress) to send clear and concise messages about the need to establish a new and positive approach in US relations with Equatorial Guinea.
- Representatives of the Consultant and the Client will meet frequently and whenever one of the parties should deem it necessary for the performance of their respective obligations under the terms of this Contract. The Client has the exclusive right to authorize and approve the content and scope of the services provided by the Consultant.
- The Client may designate as confidential any information that it provides the Consultant under the terms of this Contract.
- The Consultant may never disclose such information without the Client's permission.

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### **PAYMENTS**

- The Client shall pay the Consultant for services rendered under the terms of this contract an annual fee of three hundred thousand US Dollars (\$ 300,000.00). This fee is inclusive of all ordinary and necessary expenses incurred by C/R in its work on behalf of Client, but does not include extraordinary expenses such as travel and related expenses, for which the client will reimburse the consultant upon receipt of an invoice.
- Payment of the fees will be made as follows:
  - a) 50% (150,000) upon signature of this contract.
  - b) 40% (120,000) six months thereafter, upon receipt of invoices from the Consultant.

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c) The remaining 10% will be paid to the Consultant upon submission to the Client of the final report of the services provided to the Client.

- This Contract shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of the parties hereto and their respective successors and assigns.
- This Contract constitutes the entire agreement of the parties hereto with respect to the subject matter hereof and supercedes any and all prior agreements with respect to such subject matter between Consultant and Client.
- All notices required under this Contract shall be given in writing by personal delivery, telecopy (with confirmation of receipt), or certified mail (return receipt requested), addressed to C/R International, L.L.C., 1150 17th St. NW, Suite 406, Washington, DC 20036, Attention: Robert J. Cabelly; and to Client at the address set forth below. Notice by personal delivery or telecopy shall be effective when received and notice by certified mail shall be effective when deposited in the mail.


