Thanks again for taking my call.

To follow up on our conversation yesterday, I am attaching for background information for Senator Graham and you a copy of the letter that we understand was handed to Secretary Clinton by the Kuwaiti Foreign Minister during their meeting in Abu Dhabi on June 9. Also enclosed is the English translation. As you will see from the translation, the Government of Kuwait expressed some urgency about commencing negotiations on the two remaining Kuwaiti citizens at Guantanamo. Almost two months have passed, however, with no response from the State Department, although we have been informed that a response is being prepared. We would appreciate it if you would use this material for background only and seek a copy from the State Department if the Senator wishes to pursue the matter.

Also, as I mentioned, we would be happy to work with the Senator to try to come up with a broader coalition to put pressure on the Administration to stop sweeping under the rug the Guantanamo issue and treatment of future detainees, and to work with Congress on a comprehensive legislative scheme.

I am writing you to follow up on my letter dated February 3, 2011, regarding the suffering of the two Kuwaiti citizens Mohammed Al Kandari and Faouzi Khaled Al Odeh, who are still held at the Guantanamo prison. It has now been ten years since these two detainees were arrested and detained without a fair trial and without having been charged with any crime. This lengthy detention is worrisome for the people and the government of Kuwait. As we already mentioned in previous letters, we are attaching a list with the names of the members of the Kuwaiti delegation selected by the government of Kuwait to negotiate the return of our citizens with the government of the United States, in accordance with the terms previously agreed upon by both governments, which include the establishment of a rehabilitation center for returning detainees, to which your government has already agreed.

It is imperative that the negotiations between the two delegations start immediately and, if possible, conclude before the month of Ramadan, which will start on August 3, 2011. The return of the Kuwaiti citizens is a dire priority and an urgent matter for the government and the people of Kuwait. Any further delay in resolving this issue will have an adverse effect on the people of Kuwait, as was clearly demonstrated lately by the events that unfolded in the Parliament. The indefinite detention of our citizen without any trial or charges brought against them for ten years is not only unacceptable for the government and the people of Kuwait, but is also in contradiction with the rule of law and the commitment to respect and uphold human rights, which your government and yourself support.

Therefore, we are fully confident that you will give this matter the necessary importance and treat it with the required sense of urgency, and instruct the representatives of your government to prepare for immediate negotiations. Our delegation will contact the special envoy in charge of closing the Guantanamo Bay detention facility or any other envoy that you designate, within the next week, to discuss the schedules of the meetings.

We hope that these negotiations will start immediately and will end with fruitful results for the mutual benefit of our governments and our peoples.

We invite you to join us in sending the following letter to President Obama regarding the sale of F-16s to the Republic of China (Taiwan).

As you know, in 2010, the Obama Administration released a \$6.4 billion arms package to Taiwan that included Patriot missiles, Black Hawk helicopters, mine hunters and military communications equipment. While we welcomed this very positive step, we were disappointed the package did not include sixty-six F-16 fighter aircraft that Taiwan has sought as well.

Taiwan lives under a constant military threat from the People's Republic of China (PRC), which has an estimated 1,400 short and medium-range ballistic missiles pointed directly at Taiwan. The U.S. Defense Intelligence Agency recently concluded that Taiwan's air defense is showing increasing vulnerability due to the aging of their air force fighter aircraft, in contrast to the PRC's increasing military capabilities.

Taiwan is a fellow democracy facing a very serious threat. At this crucial time in their history and in U.S.-Taiwan relations, we hope you will join us in sending this important letter, to ensure our ally's future security and stability. Dear Mr. President:

We are writing to express our concerns about the military imbalance in the Taiwan

Strait. In order to maintain peace and stability in the Taiwan Strait, we believe it is critical for the United States to approve the pending sale of all F-16 C/D aircraft that the government of Taiwan has requested. We respectfully request that your administration move quickly to notify Congress of this pending sale.

Successive reports issued by U.S. and Taiwanese defense authorities outline the threat Taiwan continues to face, including the continued military buildup by the People's Republic of China. For example, Beijing has more than 1,400 missiles aimed at Taiwan and continues to add to this total. China is forging ahead and deploying next generation military technology. Military experts both in Taiwan and in the United States have raised alarms that Taiwan is losing its qualitative advantage in defensive arms that have long served as a primary military deterrent.

Due to impending changes within Taiwan's force structure, we respectfully urge a timely resolution to the aircraft sale issue. Within the next decade Taiwan will retire 70% of its fighter force and without new fighter aircraft and upgrades to its existing fleet of F-16s, Taiwan's situation could become quite precarious.

As you know, the Taiwan Relations Act of 1979 (TRA) states that it is U.S. policy "to consider any effort to determine the future of Taiwan by other than peaceful means...of grave concern to the United States." We remain deeply concerned that delays in the decision on the sale of F-16s to Taiwan and subsequently notifying Congress of their sale could very well result in closure of the F-16 assembly line. In addition to enhancing Taiwan's security, approval of the pending sale would support thousands of American jobs-especially well-paying jobs in the manufacturing sector.

Thank you for your consideration. We look forward to your reply.
