Hong Kong Trade Development Council: The registrant provides advice, support and assistance in lobbying the Congress and the Executive Branch on legislation and policies affecting the trade interests of Hong Kong, including China's MFN status; U.S. implementation of WTO agreements; export control and strategic trade; fast track authority, textile bills, 301 statutes; NADTA, FTAA, APEC; anti-dumping legislation and actions, environmental protection, labor rights, and competition policy issues. The registrant also researches and monitors legislative and administrative activities with regard to the above issues.

Central American Bank for Economic Integration (CABEI): Provided strategic counsel and direct representation before Congress and the Executive Branch. Met with members and staff of the House and Senate and worked with American business allies to coordinate strategies and efforts in support of H.R. 984 and S. 371 (with the goal of giving CBI countries parity with Mexico under NAFTA).

We provided grassroots advice on how to energize other supporters of the legislation within congressional districts and states. We have met with Administration officials regarding the legislation.

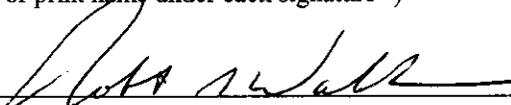
