INSTRUCTIONS: A registrant must furnish as an Exhibit B copies of each written agreement and the terms and conditions of each oral agreement with his foreign principal, including all modifications of such agreements, or, where no contract exists, a full statement of all the circumstances by reason of which the registrant is acting as an agent of a foreign principal. One original and two legible photocopies of this form shall be filed for each foreign principal named in the registration statement and must be signed by or on behalf of the registrant.

Privacy Act Statement. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the Registration Unit in Washington, D.C. This report is available to the public. Finally, the Attorney General intends, at the earliest possible opportunity, to make these public documents available on the Internet on the Department of Justice World Wide Web site.

The nature of the agreement is to communicate as widely as possible, to as great an audience as possible, the current situation in Equatorial Guinea, particularly in regard to human rights and corruption, and to seek support for the introduction of democracy and the rule of law into that country, all of which ends would be accomplished with the free and fair election to the presidency of Equatorial Guinea the candidate of the Partido del Progreso, Severo Moto Nsa. All activities under this agreement, as stated in the attached contract, are to be legal and above board.


8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

Registrant proposes to inform policy-makers and members of the public, by word of mouth, in writing, speaking, articles, publications and such other means of communication which may be available and legal, including face-to-face meetings, concerning the oppressive situation in Equatorial Guinea, and to seek support for the introduction of democracy and democratic practices in that country. Registrant will urge others to make their views known to policy-makers.

9. Will the activities on behalf of the above foreign principal include political activities as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act and in the footnote below? Yes No

If yes, describe all such political activities indicating, among other things, the relations, interests or policies to be influenced together with the means to be employed to achieve this purpose.

Registrant will try to inform members of Congress and their staffs of the desperate situation in Equatorial Guinea in the hope of getting United States support for ending the human rights abuses in Equatorial Guinea and for introducing democratic practices there. Registrant will make similar efforts with the Executive Branch, including but not limited to the State Department, USAID, etc. Registrant will urge others with knowledge of the situation in Equatorial Guinea or with an interest in improving human rights there to petition their government to seek an end to those abuses and other irregularities in Equatorial Guinea.

Footnote: Political activity as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act means any activity which the person engaging in believes will, or that the person intends to, in any way influence any agency or official of the Government of the United States or any section of the public within the United States with reference to formulating, adopting, or changing the domestic or foreign policies of the United States or with reference to the political interests, policies, or relations of a government of a foreign country or a foreign political party.

CONTRACT FOR THE RETAINING OF PROFESSIONAL SERVICES

This is a contract between the Progressive Party (hereafter Party), a political party active both within and outside Equatorial Guinea, an African country, with its principal place of business at number 78-1, Velazquez Street, Madrid 28,005, Spain and Mr. Frank Ruddy, American lawyer with offices at 1825 I Street, Suite 400, Washington, D.C. 20006.

In exchange for the sum of one dollar receipt of which is acknowledged by Mr. Ruddy, both parties agree as follows:

The Party desires that the Congress of the United States as well as the citizens of this country be permanently and properly informed about the condition of human rights and civil rights in Guinea Equatorial as well as the efforts and commitment of the Party to protect and guarantee those rights, directing those efforts at ousting the current government [of Equatorial Guinea] by means of political activity culminating in the election as President of Equatorial Guinea, in free and democratic elections, Mr. Severo Moto Nsa, President of the Party.

With this in mind, the Party authorizes Mr. Frank Ruddy, and he accepts as of the date of this contract, to come up with and develop whatever types of communications which in his judgment are appropriate for achieving these ends, provided however that in so doing he abide by all laws of the United States.

In compensation for the professional services of Mr. Ruddy, the Party agrees to pay the sum of \$ 150 (One Hundred Fifty Dollars) per hour of work under this contract, or, if agreeable to the parties, identical value in other currency, PROVIDED HOWEVER, that all payment is conditioned on Mr. Severo Moto Nsa's becoming President of Equatorial Guinea, and the Party shall have no obligation to pay Mr. Ruddy unless that happens.

For his part, Mr. Ruddy will maintain for the inspection of the Party an account of the hours billable under this contract.

Both parties acknowledge the right of the other to dissolve this contract by advising the other party in writing.
