defense less of democracy than of America's reputation with its allies and enemies, Kahn has long viewed many policies, particularly the bombing of the North's industrial areas, as mistaken and ineffective. Indeed, in his Vietnam book he recommended (or predicted) the cessation of bombing north of the 19th parallel.

Negotiations between Israel and the Arabs are, to his mind, more likely to succeed than bargaining with Ho Chi Minh, whom Kahn takes to be "a dedicated Communist who would have a better chance of winning his war if he could drop Communism again, as he did in 1946-52." Always willing to contemplate any alternative, Kahn regards outright American withdrawal as a feasible possibility that "the U.S. could do two or three times before it loses credibility. But this is a currency one should spend very carefully, if at all. Also, it would make us incredibly rigid in the next confrontation. Let me tell you another thing. From a cold, amoral point of view, this is a vintage year for renegeing international commitments—no Hitlers, Stalins or even Maos could take advantage—but from the domestic perspective 1968 would be the worst year in history, escalating enormous internal divisions and strains."

He thinks that, first of all, the United States must posit a persuasive and defensible theory of "victory," which he suggests should be based not only upon "reducing the level of violence in the South to, say, that of Central Park," but also on territory, so that the point of victory, as well as our proximity to it, can be empirically measured. "Serious negotiations," he remarks anxiously, his sentences leaping from point to point, "are not yet likely, because Ho Chi Minh feels that by holding out he can do better. Twice before—in 1946 and 1954—the North Vietnamese felt that they lost at the negotiating table what they had won on the battlefield. These men are too dedicated and principled to accept an agonizing compromise now, particularly when they are informed by all visitors that the U.S. home front is collapsing. Richard Nixon's first order of business will be trying to achieve a reasonable settlement. While I think such an

speed and pumping his right arm: "The U.S. should advance as generous an offer as it can stand, making clear to both itself and foreigners that it cannot negotiate indefinitely and that, if negotiations fail, it has a serious and plausible strategy for winning the war, probably without escalation." The Hudson Institute, he proudly asserts, leaning back in his chair, has offered suggestions for such a strategy.

Officially, Kahn is a registered Democrat. However, he feels that the left-right characterizations of a decade ago are outdated. It would be more correct to classify him as a rationalist and a believer in necessary change. "Our civilization does more things on a consciously 'rationalized' basis than any before in history, rather than succumbing to traditions or explicit emotional desires," he said, "but this does not mean that our behavior is always rational." A look of disappointment

crossed his face, only to fall away. "It does mean, however, that people in government are willing to listen to arguments based upon rationality. A persuasive position—honed on skeptics, rather than friends and relatives—can be tremendously influential with American bureaucracies. This is particularly true if one goes to the trouble of making his points clear to everyone concerned and then waits for the inevitable crisis that spurs them to action."

THE primary deficiencies of Kahn's intelligence are entwined in his virtues. Although he can enumerate and systematically analyze all the obvious forces shaping a situation, his books often suffer from an inappropriate, if not downright distorted,

thorough, definitive exposition of anything he discusses, and though he strives for a complex understanding of a multifaceted problem, he nonetheless simplifies for the sake of a neat analysis. He usually buttresses an argument with abundant statistics and examples, yet too often he facetiously establishes a generalization upon merely a striking anecdote or neglects substantial advice for enticing but glib interpretations. Though he is instinctively gracious as a debater, in a pinch he has been known to become a graceless I.Q. bigot. Although he will skeptically question every dimension of American policy, he is too much of a patriot to ask publicly if American purposes are fundamentally right and just. Finally, perhaps because his enthusiasm for his own ingenious ideas often deflects his critical sense, he espouses faintly gimmicky solutions at the same time that he derides them in others.

ONE of his major assets is a thoroughly avant-garde sensibility—for just as the experimental artist hesitates to execute works that too closely resemble his earlier successes, so Kahn himself continually forsakes his previous interests to explore uncharted territories. He finds he can no longer think extensively about thermonuclear war, largely because he has so little new to say about it and fears the dull recitation of earlier thoughts. Not only does he courageously confront the major unthought problems of the moment—thermonuclear war in the late fifties, limited war in the early sixties, the future in the late sixties—but he relishes insights that perceptively measure how the situation today differs from that of six months, a year or two years ago. He reads new books by the cartload, surveys scores of magazines, accumulates new information and ideas from everyone he meets; by keeping up with the present he escalates his mind into the future.

His book "The Year 2000" he considers just the first of several forays into thinking about our prospects. He and Weiner are currently doing a book on "Faustian Progress" (as well as founding The International Journal of Future Studies). Its subtitle labels it a "framework for speculation."
