January 23 to April 20	BRUSSELS	<u>SPORT IN HELLAS</u> : a special exhibition documenting the origins, character and relevance of games and sport in ancient Greece. Vases, bronze figures, marble statues and terracotta objects from 52 museums and private collections will be on display during this unique exhibition which will be held in the Palais des Beaux Arts.
January 29 to April 26	BRUSSELS	<u>LACE BIENNAL</u> : Bi-annual exhibition and competition of modern works of lace. People from all over Europe participate in this competition. The distribution of the prizes takes place in the presence of Her Royal Highness Queen Fabiola of Belgium in the Brussels' Town Hall. The winners as well as other selected works will then be displayed in the Museum of Costume and Lace.
March 1+2+3	BINCHE	<u>GILLES OF BINCHE CARNIVAL</u> : world-famous Lenten Carnival which has been celebrated for more than 430 years. The colorful costumed day-long celebration attracts thousands of visitors annually.
March 6-21	BRUSSELS	<u>FILM FESTIVAL OF THE FANTASTIC</u> : annual film festival showing science-fiction and horror movies.
March 7	OSTEND	<u>DEAD RAT'S BALL</u> : Carnival with a competition for the best costume.
May	LAEKEN	<u>ROYAL GREENHOUSES</u> : The Greenhouses of the Royal Palace at Laeken, a suburb of Brussels, are open to the public for a few dates each year. The one and a half kilometer trip through the greenhouses takes visitors past giant ferns, banana trees, grottoes, glades and grassy vistas.
May 10-24	BRUSSELS	<u>ANTIQUES FAIR</u> : Important collections of furniture, paintings, objects, etc.... at the Palais des Beaux Arts.
May	BRUSSELS	<u>QUEEN ELISABETH MUSIC COMPETITION FOR SOLOISTS</u> : public concerts of finalists and laureats.
May 22-24	BRUSSELS	<u>JAZZ RALLYE</u> : during this weekend jazz lovers can enjoy their favorite music in bars and clubs all over the city.
May 28	BRUGES	<u>HOLY BLOOD PROCESSION</u> : Commences at 3:00PM with floats and groups depicting the principal events of the Bible and the veneration of the vial of the Holy Blood brought back from the Crusades by the Count of Flanders in 1150.

May 31	BRUSSELS	<u>20 KM OF BRUSSELS</u> : Jogging through the streets of Brussels - national and international participation.
June 16 to August 10	KNOKKE-HEIST	<u>INTERNATIONAL CARTOON FESTIVAL</u> : Annual competition and exhibition of original cartoons by artists from over 50 countries shown at the Humor Hall of Laguna Beach.
June 30 & July 2	BRUSSELS	<u>OMMEGANG PAGEANT</u> : a historical festival of Medieval Pageantry presented at 9:00 PM on the Grand'Place, recreating a 1539 reception for Charles V and his court. Nobles are represented by descendants of the original families.
July 4+5	TORHOUT-WERCHTER	<u>TORHOUT-WERCHTER ROCK FESTIVAL</u> : Internationally famous rock stars and groups perform open-air concerts at the Torhout and Werchter festival grounds.
July 26	VEURNE	<u>PROCESSION OF THE PENITENTS</u> : religious procession through the town depicting the major biblical events; centerpiece of the procession is "Christ" bearing a heavy cross, followed by the penitents.
August	FRANCORCHAMPS	<u>FORMULA 1 GRAND'PRIX OF BELGIUM AT FRANCORCHAMPS</u> : The Formula I Grand Prix of Belgium will be held at the famous Spa-Francorchamps race track in August. Nearby is the original 'Spa', famous for its health and fitness resorts and its casino.
August 14	MONS	<u>PROCESSION OF THE GOLDEN CHARIOT AND BATTLE OF THE LUMECON</u> : (St. George and the Dragon). The horse-drawn golden coach which carries a reliquary of St. Waudru circles the town. The procession commemorates the delivery of Mons from the Plague in 1349. In the afternoon in the town square, St. George fights the dragon amidst colorful merrymaking; and good triumphs over evil.

Ivo Van Damme was the Belgian runner who took two silver medals in the 800 and 1500 meters at the Montreal Olympics in 1976 and died a few months later in a road accident.
October 7-17	GHENT	<u>INTERNATIONAL FILM EVENT OF FLANDERS</u> : a festival depicting the relationship between music and films - at the Decascoop and Studioskoop in Ghent.
Nov. 26-29	BRUSSELS	<u>INTERNATIONAL EQUESTRIAN JUMPING</u> : this show will bring together a 'Who's Who' of top riders and mounts at the Heysel Exhibition Center. It is also a trade show of equestrian wares and equipment.
December 11+12+13	BRUSSELS	<u>EUROPEAN CHRISTMAS MARKET</u> : the giant fair of Xmas traditions is reminiscent of the cities of the Middle Ages. In addition to the tempting 'buys' there will be jugglers, magicians, painters, musical groups, both vocal and instrumental, to add to the fun.

HANKAR EXHIBITION AT BRUSSELS' FOUNDATION FOR ARCHITECTURE

Victor Horta and Henry Van de Velde enjoy enduring fame, while Paul Hankar, the third member of the turn-of-the-century triumvirate of extraordinary Belgian architects has been relatively neglected. Now the Foundation for Architecture in Brussels is devoting its current exhibition, due to run until March 1, 1992 to the brief years of Hankar's triumph, which was cut short by his death in 1906 at the age of 45. 1893 marks the birth of the Art Nouveau movement and Hector Guimard, who introduced this aesthetic style to France, freely acknowledged his debt to the architects of Brussels. With its use of exotic African woods for furniture and of ivory for objects of art, Art Nouveau in Brussels was for some time referred to as 'le style Congo'. This was due to the fact that Hankar and other leading Art Nouveau figures designed the interiors of the African Museum's International Exposition of 1897.

ANTWERP IS DESIGNATED "CULTURAL CAPITAL OF EUROPE" FOR 1993

The annual designation of a particular European city as the Cultural Capital of Europe was initiated in 1985 by the Greek Minister of Culture, Melina Mercouri. In keeping with this tradition, the European Ministers of Culture chose Antwerp for 1993.

In its programming "Antwerp '93" consciously restricts itself to the arts and the applied arts, with a strong emphasis on the contemporary : music, theatre, dance and opera; visual arts; architecture; literature; film, photography and media art; and fashion.

Significant attention also goes to high-quality entertainment, to several events such as the diamond exhibitions, Sail '93 (an impressive fleet of historic sailing ships from all over the world), the Antwerp Zoo's 150th birthday and many other attractions that will animate the whole city.

BRUSSELS ROYAL PALACE OPEN TO VISITORS JULY 30 - SEPTEMBER 13, 1992

The Brussels Royal Palace will be open to visitors during 1992 from July 30 to September 13, every day except Monday from 9:30AM to 3:30PM. The Palace is situated on the Place des Palais facing the Palais de la Nation, home of the Belgian Parliament, across from the Park of Brussels. The Park, once part of the hunting ground of the Dukes of Brabant, was the scene of fierce fighting in 1830 when Belgium gained her independence.

Ever since the 12th century when the Counts of Louvain built a fortress on the Coudenberg hill, there has been a noble residence overlooking the Park of Brussels. Later occupants included the Dukes of Brabant and Burgundy and Charles V. In 1731 the Palace burnt to the ground, after which plans for the present neo-classic structure were drawn up, and although the Palace was modified during Austrian, French and Dutch rule, the buildings remained essentially the same until Leopold II instituted renovations which were carried out between 1868 and 1872.

The King and Queen reside in the Palace of Laeken, but King Baudouin has his offices here and it is used for state receptions, royal audiences and court ceremonies. The Throne Room is particularly impressive; over 150 feet long it has an elaborate mosaic parquet floor and is lit by eleven chandeliers. Other rooms on view are the Blue Room, the Louis XVI Music Salon with its ebony piano inset with copper and semi-precious stones, the Goya Room, hung with tapestries modeled on paintings by the Spanish Court painter, the Empire Room, the two White Salons and the Mirror Room, panelled in elaborately carved oak with four ceiling-high mirrors set between fluted marble columns.
