

Privacy Act Statement. 





Re: Legal Representation

Dear Tricia:

As is our usual practice, I am taking this opportunity to advise the Embassy of our policies on billing, etc., and to confirm our fee schedule.

It is our understanding that the Embassy is retaining our firm to provide advice regarding wet leasing issues in connection with HMG's discussions with the US government regarding the liberalization of cargo service between the UK and the US. We would also render such other aviation-related advice as the Embassy requests and we agree to provide.

Our usual practice is to require an advance retainer from new clients; however, in light of our existing relationship, I do not believe that an advance retainer is required in this instance.

We bill for our services on an hourly basis (with one-tenth hour as minimum increment) at the rates shown in Exhibit A. Our policy is to render invoices on a monthly basis, which are payable upon receipt. Accounts over 30 days past due accrue interest at the rate of 1% per month. The attached rates may be revised periodically, although no more frequently than semi-annually.

In addition to legal fees, we bill for out-of-pocket expenses and certain related overhead expenses incurred on the Embassy's behalf. These include agency filing fees, photocopying, travel expenses, messenger services, telephone charges, postage computerized legal research, and staff overtime. These expenses are generally billed in arrears (normally 60 days after they are

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incurred). However, if the amounts involved are substantial, the Embassy may be asked to advance sums of these expenses, pay them directly or invoices may be forwarded to the Embassy for direct payment.

Our entitlement to fees and reimbursements for disbursements is not contingent upon the final outcome of any particular matter that you have requested us to undertake. We cannot and do not warrant or predict final developments or results regarding any matter.

We reserve the right to terminate our representation at any time if a conflict of interest develops or is discovered, or if there exists at any time any fact or circumstance that would, in our opinion, render our continuing representation unlawful, unethical, or otherwise inappropriate. If we elect to terminate our representation, the Embassy agrees to cooperate and take all steps reasonably necessary to free us of any further obligation to perform legal services, including the execution of any documents necessary to complete our withdrawal from representation. In such case, the Embassy agrees to pay for all legal services performed and expenses incurred before the termination of our representation in accordance with the provisions of this agreement. Please be advised that we assume no duty to update the Embassy about any matter in which we may have previously advised or represented the Embassy.

It is understood and agreed that we may accept the representation of other persons whose general business interest may be unrelated matters compete with or be adverse to the Embassy, as long as there is not an actual or direct conflict of interest.


We believe the above arrangements are standard, and trust they will meet with your approval. If so, would you please arrange to have both copies of this engagement letter signed and one copy returned to me.
