12. The individuals listed in my registration were individuals with whom conversations were held. During the six month reporting period, there were no visits by PAN officials to Washington. The individuals listed in my original report were those individuals with whom I had conversations regarding the future visits of Deputies Borunda and Navarette to Washington, DC. These meetings took place in October 2001 and will be covered in the next reporting period.

Embassy of Japan

11. During the reporting period, I arranged two lunches for Embassy staff. The lunch with Mr. Shogren had been inadvertently reported on the supplemental statement ending March 31, 2001. The lunch with Mr. Biegun was inadvertently not included in either statement.

On May 10, a lunch was held with Mr. Steven Biegun, Staff Director for the Republican Staff of the Senate Foreign Relations Committee and on April 11, a lunch was held with Mr. Brett Shogren, Policy Analyst with the Office of House Majority Whip Tom Delay. I attended these two luncheons. During the lunch with Mr. Shogren the issues discussed included US China relations in light of the recent aircraft collision, H.R. 1198 relating to Prisoners of War, and the Kyoto Treaty. During the lunch with Mr. Biegun, the issues discussed included the future trip of President Bush to Asia, the aftermath of the tragic submarine disaster killing Japanese citizens, and future Senate Foreign Relations Committee hearings on Asia.. No other meetings were held.

During the reporting period, I telephoned Congressional staff from time to time to inquire about the status of certain legislation and policy issues. At no time during any of my conversations with US government officials have I represented the views of the Government of Japan.
