





It is expected the Foundation will undertake certain activities and incur expenses to ensure a successful visit, e.g. transportation, meals, lodging, and other categories. It is understood that the Foundation will arrange advance payment for these expenses. If it is more convenient for TLG to do so, then the Foundation will provide TLG with a credit card account, advance payment of funds, or other financial information necessary so TLG can make and secure reservations and handle logistical details and other expenses associated with any visits. No expenditure or commitment of funds will be made by TLG without the approval of the Foundation.
5. This MOU will remain in effect until either The Foundation or TLG advises of cancellation in writing or by mutual written agreement of both parties.


