Dear Senator [name]:

As the Senate Appropriations Foreign Operations Subcommittee will soon mark up its bill, please consider passing a bill without conditions on ESF and FMF to Egypt.

In July, the Supreme Council of the Armed Forces (SCAF) visited Capitol Hill and was able to meet with a few members of the Subcommittee. The conversation centered on the significance of the US-Egyptian bilateral relationship and the proposals of the House Foreign Operations Subcommittee mark up of its bill.

Since the resignation of former President Hosni Mubarak, the Egyptian military has been compelled to step in to oversee all operations of government. This includes areas for which the Egyptian military has not previously been responsible, such as managing the economy and policing – maintaining law and order on the streets. One can't overstate the challenges faced by the Egyptian military, for many problems existed long before the Egyptian revolution and will take time to remedy.

The transition period must be viewed in this light. The SCAF has dedicated itself to building a democratic Egypt, but until a new civilian-led government is elected, it is committed to upholding order even under the most trying of circumstances. But to be certain, problems have arisen, and they will continue to emerge. And as they do, the SCAF has and will continue to do its utmost to prevent unrest, violence, and lawless conduct – not an easy task considering the highly emotional climate existing today in Egypt and throughout the Arab world.

We note, the House Appropriations Foreign Operations Subcommittee passed a bill that includes certification by the US Administration of Egypt's compliance on designated items on ESF only. FMF remains unconditioned.

The House version also includes a new potentially sensitive provision in the FMF language: "with the expectation that the Egyptian military will continue to adhere to and implement its international obligations, particularly the Egypt-Israel Peace Treaty." While this is a stated expectation – which the government of Egypt remains committed to – the government of Egypt is working hard to manage the rise of nationalism and anti-Israel sentiment on the street. The appearance of the US publicly pushing Egypt regarding its relationship with Israel at this time will be counterproductive – both for Israel and for the United States. Secretary Clinton has engaged the Egyptian Foreign Minister and his Israeli counterpart. Both reiterated their commitment to peace. And, the Secretary also reiterated her view that the Egyptian-Israeli peace is a cornerstone to regional stability.

The Senate Appropriations Foreign Operations Subcommittee has been extremely supportive of Egypt. Given the current scrutiny to foreign assistance, the stated equal support of Israel and Egypt is greatly appreciated and highly important. On FMF in particular, it is widely noted that funding provided to Egypt's military is well worth the benefit to US national security interests in the region.

Continued assistance, in accordance with the Camp David Accords, will assist Egypt in a

challenging time of political and economic transition, to maintain peace and stability. The transitional government is working hard to ensure a successful democratic transition.

I want to draw your attention to a couple of concerns my colleagues and I have with regard to the Senate Appropriations FY 2012 Foreign Ops bill.

We are concerned about the discrepancy in the characterization of funds to Israel ("not less than") and to Egypt ("up to"). For the past three decades both Israel and Egypt have received specific earmarks in their foreign assistance packages, which are directly related to the 1979 peace agreement.

We are concerned about the new provision of transfer authority, allowing the movement of appropriated funds under the FMF heading to ESF for assistance to Egypt. It is important for us to determine whether this provision was meant to provide flexibility or constraint for Egypt.

If our goal as the United States is to support Egypt in its time of democratic transition and to buttress the Egypt-Israel peace agreement, placing such limitations and conditions on assistance to Egypt is likely to have the opposite of its intended effect. As agreed to in the Camp David accords, Egypt has never wavered in its commitment to the peace agreement. The Supreme Council of the Armed Forces (SCAF) is doing its utmost to move the nation of Egypt forward in a democratic transition. The legislative language places the SCAF under greater pressure to respond Egyptian public opinion which is likely to perceive the political conditions as foreign interference.

As the appropriations process for FY 2012 will not happen with regular order, we want to express our concerns in ways that will be supportive to the Committee as it moves the bill through its ultimate conclusion.

Egyptian Foreign Minister Mohamed Kamel Amr is in town this week for meetings with the US Administration. Please let us know if you are interested in meeting with the Minister while he is in town this Wednesday and Thursday.
