

Privacy Act Statement. No fees are being paid and my services are pro bono, based upon my long standing relationship with Eritrea.

To prepare materials, letters, faxes, brochures, maps and other documents to educate Members of Congress, the Executive Branch and the people in general.

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8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

I intend to provide the materials described in Item 7 to Members of Congress, the Executive Branch, to write letters to newspapers and to meet with labor union officials to educate them about the origins of Ethiopia's invasion of Eritrea, the human rights violations committed against Eritreans living in Ethiopia and the need to support Eritrea in its struggle to maintain its independence and democracy.

If yes, describe all such political activities indicating, among other things, the relations, interests or policies to be influenced together with the means to be employed to achieve this purpose.

To meet with Members of Congress and the Executive Branch and to educate them about the nature of Eritrea and to change the pro-Ethiopian bias of the U.S. State Department and to argue against debt forgiveness for Ethiopia by the U.S. Government, until Ethiopia fully accepts the sovereignty and existence of Eritrea through internationally recognized borders, and pays compensation for expropriation of American-owned businesses in Ethiopia, and Eritreans living in Ethiopia and for the wanton destruction of hospitals, schools and private property during the invasion of Eritrea.
