**MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT**

The Utrök Atoll Local Government (UALGOV) hereby retains Van Scoyoc Associates, Inc. (VSA) as consultants and advisors to achieve the following federal objectives: 1) gain passage of federal legislation (HR 2584) to transfer a decommissioned NOAA ship to the UALGOV; 2) include language in an appropriations bill establishing and funding a radiological remediation trust fund for the UALGOV; 3) secure federal funding for the resettlement of the Utrök Community. VSA will perform such services with regard to those issues as are mutually agreed to between VSA and UALGOV.

It is understood that VSA may be required to register under the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995 (P.L. 104-65) on behalf of UALGOV.

In consideration of the performance of these services, UALGOV shall pay to VSA the sum of \$5,000.00 per month, with such payments due monthly and in advance. Reasonable expenses actually incurred in the performance of services under this Agreement and directly attributable thereto are included in the retainer.

This Agreement shall become effective August 1, 2003, and shall continue in effect until at least March 31, 2004, or until terminated by UALGOV or VSA by written notice given to the other at least 15 days prior to the proposed date of termination.

## MEMORANDUM OF AGREEMENT

Forensic Science Service, Ltd. ("FSS") hereby retains Van Scoyoc Associates, Inc. ("VSA") as consultants and advisors with regard to various federal agencies and legislative issues. VSA undertakes to monitor and evaluate these issues and to advise FSS on the components of an agency and legislative plan and the appropriate strategy necessary to achieve the goals of such a plan. VSA will perform such services with regard to those issues as are mutually agreed to between VSA and FSS, as specified in the Addendum attached hereto which is incorporated into and made a part of this Memorandum of Agreement (this "Agreement").

It is understood that VSA may be required to register on behalf of FSS under the terms of the Lobbying Disclosure Act of 1995, as amended (2 USC §1601 et seq.) and any subsequent laws or regulations.

In consideration of the performance of these services, FSS shall pay to VSA the sum of \$15,000 per month, with such payments due monthly and in advance. Reasonable expenses actually incurred in the performance of services under this Agreement and directly attributable thereto shall also be paid by FSS, provided that any request for reimbursement is accompanied by receipts documenting such expenses. Any individual expense in excess of \$250.00 and all long-distance travel must be pre-approved. The Parties agree that upon the aggregate sum of all expenses not requiring pre-approval reaching \$5000.00, they shall review the expenses incurred in pursuance of this Agreement. FSS represents and warrants that these payments shall not be made with federally appropriated funds. Sums owed by FSS to VSA shall accrue interest at a rate of 1.5% per month if unpaid after ninety (90) days.

This Agreement shall be binding upon and inure to the benefit of FSS, its successors and assigns. VSA may not assign this Agreement without the prior written consent of FSS.

This Agreement shall become effective April 1, 2008 and shall continue in effect until March 31, 2009 or until terminated at will by FSS or VSA, for any reason or for no reason at all, by written notice given to the other at least 30 days prior to the proposed date of termination.

This Agreement shall be deemed to be a contract made under the laws of the state of New York and for all purposes shall be construed in accordance with said laws, without regard to its choice of laws principles. In the event of a dispute between the parties, they mutually consent to arbitration as specified in the Addendum attached hereto. The prevailing party shall be entitled to costs and interest on any award at the rate of 1.5% per month to run from ten business days after the date of the award.
