MR. PRESIDENT. As President Bush continues his visit to India, I want to take this opportunity to wish him well and to salute that nation for its most impressive economic progress in recent years. Along with its economy, India's vibrant culture and strong democratic tradition is transforming this country into a truly global power. In January, I led a 20 member delegation from the United States on a good-will visit to India. What we saw was a country and an economy experiencing historic progress. Companies in India are growing at a phenomenal pace, with many showing gains of 15 to 25 percent per year. In the past decade, India has been the second fastest growing economy in the world with an annual growth rate above 6 percent. Last year that figure jumped to 7.5 percent. Goldman-Sachs has predicted that India will be the fastest growing economy in the world over the next 50 years.

I am pleased that this economic growth has been accompanied by increasing levels of cooperation between India and the United States, not only in a wide variety of commercial fields, but also in the strategic military field and in the global war on terror. I am particularly pleased with the recently signed bilateral civil nuclear cooperation agreement which will bring significant benefits to both countries.

Mr. President, I also would like to take this opportunity to recognize Prime Minister Manmohan Singh for the central role he has played, both as Finance Minister and in his present office, in instituting the economic reforms which became a turning point in India's economy and for his role in transforming relations between the United States and India. I salute India and her people and am pleased that our two countries are joined in pursuing a bright path into the future.

MR. PRESIDENT. As we all know, President Bush is currently paying a visit to India and, we can recall, that six years ago President Clinton made a similar journey. These visits, one by a Republican President and one by a Democratic President, clearly demonstrate the bipartisan recognition of the growing importance of India to the United States and to the world community at large.

The future for India and its economic potential is, simply put, startling. A study conducted by Goldman-Sachs in 2003 concluded that India will be the fastest growing of the world's economies over the next 50 years. The study project that the Indian economy will be larger than that of Italy in 10 years, and larger than Britain's in 15 years. Today, India is one of the world's five largest economies and the Goldman-Sachs study predicts that by 2040 it will grow to be the world's third largest economy.

In a wide variety of commercial fields including space exploration, information technology, energy, as well as highly sophisticated health research and treatment models, our two countries have closely cooperated to produce meaningful progress for both India and the United States.

The United States and India also share traditions and cultures which foster mutual understanding and values. We are both vibrant democracies serving as home to a wide variety of religious and ethnic groups enjoying the fruits of widely diverse cultures.

Mr. President, I am pleased to note the bright path that India has embarked upon and I look forward to increasing the close ties between our two nations.
