

For the Democratic Progressive Party, I attended conferences at the American Enterprise Institute, the Brookings Institution, the Carnegie Endowment for International Peace, the Center for a New American Security, the Center for Strategic and International Studies, the Heritage Foundation, the Korean Economic Institute, the Sigur Center of GWU, the Stimson Center and the Woodrow Wilson Center to participate in discussions of US foreign policy with a focus on US policy toward both Taiwan and China.
