

Privacy Act Statement. 

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

RETAINER AGREEMENT

The parties to this Agreement are James C. Wood, 1523 33rd Street, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20007 (hereinafter "Attorney/Consultant"), and the Republic of the Ivory Coast (hereinafter "Ivory Coast"), operating through its Embassy at 3421 Massachusetts Avenue, N.W., Washington, D.C. 20007, and Ambassador E. & P. Pascal D. Kokora.

WHEREAS, the Ivory Coast desires to diversify its economy and business partners and develop broader and stronger economic, cultural, and educational ties with the United States, and is in need of general legal advice from time to time in connection with its capacity as a foreign mission; and

WHEREAS, Attorney/Consultant is experienced in providing the type of service that the Ivory Coast seeks to achieve its aims as set out above (hereinafter "Objectives").

THEREFORE, IN CONSIDERATION OF THE ABOVE PREMISES, THE PARTIES HERETO AGREE AS FOLLOWS:

TO WIT:

In consideration of Attorney/Consultant utilizing his best efforts to achieve the Objectives sought by the Ivory Coast, the Ivory Coast agrees to pay to Attorney/Consultant through its Embassy in the United States the sum of Seven Thousand Dollars (\$7,000.00) per month as a retainer, commencing on March 20, 2003, and on the 20th of each consecutive month thereafter until the Agreement is terminated. This Agreement shall be periodically reviewed with a view toward increasing the stipend to a level commensurate with international representation fees, and shall continue in force until either party hereto shall terminate it by giving the other party thirty (30) days advance written notice of intention to terminate.

Attorney/Consultant will familiarize himself with the issues relevant to the Ivory Coast achieving its Objectives and, to this end, will meet with the Ambassador or his designee on an ongoing and periodic basis, and not less often than monthly unless otherwise mutually agreed.

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

The Ivory Coast agrees to cooperate fully with Attorney/Consultant and assist him, as appropriate, in providing information and utilizing their research capabilities to generate useful and germane data.
