CHINA & RUSSIA PLEAD FOR WORLD TO DUMP DOLLAR AND SETUP NEW WORLD CURRENCY.

In the recent World Economic forum held at Davos, both Russian Prime Minister Vladimir Putin, and Chinese premier Wen Jiabao both called for a move from the dollar to other currencies or even a new global currency. To make matters worse, new US Secretary Geithner drew a strong reaction from Premier Jiabao, "...Indeed, he is fuming over the remarks by US Treasury Secretary Tim Geithner that China was "manipulating" its currency to gain market share. Reports were circulating this afternoon in Davos that Mr Jiabao erupted into a tirade after lunch at the mere mention of Mr Geithner's name...A country that is contracting

doesn't take kindly to its major trading partners saying you have to increase the value of its currency. What they are being told to do is tantamount to economic suicide..."

ANALYSIS:

Evidence is extremely strong that China is following the same War Preparation model that Russia is using, and is, like its Russian partner, being very successful in such

preparations. Tremendous Chinese expansion of its armed forces, and military budget are exemplary of such preparations. Plus the installation of thousands of first strike offensive missiles across from Taiwan, and published plans confirm such a conclusion. Additionally, population unrest caused by the global recession and other factors might encourage and accelerate such plans.

## WHAT TO EXPECT...NEAR FUTURE:

1. We expect to see even more of such Chinese expansionism and war preparations in the next 12-36 months, including the potential for invasion/incursion into oil rich Myanmar, NorthEast India, and possibly Indonesia. The pattern that would probably be used is the same as that used by Russia in Georgia...that of local dissident rebel groups claiming independence and needing "Chinese assistance" to assure their freedom from oppression and to protect/safeguard Chinese investments in the area. Such groups already exist in NorthEast India (the NSCN), and there is "disputed territory" between China and India nearby as well (Arunachal Pradesh). The articles below outlines this situation, ripe for potential exploitation by China:

Imphal/New Delhi, Jan. 28, 2009: The Manipur police chief today submitted a report stating that Naga militants holed up in a camp at Siroy in Ukhrul began "leaving" three days back, belying claims by the Assam Rifles and the National Socialist Council of Nagalim (Isak-Muivah) that the standoff continues.

Director-general of police Yumnam Joykumar Singh, in his report submitted to the

Okram Ibobi Singh cabinet tonight, claimed that the Naga rebels had begun leaving in small groups following pressure from the Assam Rifles.

The troops laid siege to a camp set up by the NSCN (I-M) on January 19 after the militants, who are not allowed to set up camps outside Nagaland according to ceasefire ground rules, refused to give up their arms.

It is a season of mixed results in the north-east. The ceasefire between Delhi and the Isak Swu-Muivah faction of the National Socialist Council of Nagalim (NSCN-IM) has been extended indefinitely with the proviso from the Naga side that if there is no progress in the talks between the two delegations the ceasefire would be revoked immediately. The consequence could be a renewed flare-up of violence in Nagaland.

A connected development was the rejection of any ceasefire by the rival faction of the NSCN led by the Khaplang group which has pockets of control on both sides of the India-Myanmar border.

This and the rather hare-brained demand by some legislators that the Government provide licences for arms to villages contiguous to Assam-Nagaland to prevent frequent attacks by Naga hostiles on unprotected villages on the Assam side would be sure method of igniting inter-State ethnic violence. A better solution would be setting in place a string of police posts covering the forest areas as well as the built up settlements and dissuasive actions to prevent inflammatory cross-border attacks. Naga factions acting beyond the borders in pursuit of the Greater Nagalim concept need to be discouraged.

Horror was created by the ethnic cleansing conducted in what appeared to be a joint operation by the United Liberation Front of Asom (ULFA) and a like-minded Karbi Longri National Liberation Front (KLNLFF) of Bihar-origin Hindi-speaking labourers.

The allegation has surfaced that ULFA, apparently the senior partner in this coalition of terror, is acting on behalf of the Pakistani Army's Inter-Services Intelligence (ISI) through Bangladesh to get rid of other ethnic Indians from the north-east and make room for a new influx of Bangladeshi migrants.

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

Naga society is steeped in Christianity and the Church is a major influence on society. Christian religion is synonymous with Naga nationalism, even with the NSCN-IM carrying the slogan 'Nagaland for Christ,' which Th Muivah, Secretary of NSCN-IM said in an interview was the 'manifestation that Nagas can never part with their faith in Christ the savior.'

Newspapers editorials on the Naga issue oft underscore the religion theme. A Nagaland Post editorial 'A time to heal,' stresses that the common Christian faith is the common bond that brings different Naga tribes together.

'The Church therefore plays a vital role as a mediator for reconciliation. Biblically, the first step towards reconciliation is repentance before God and to seek forgiveness. From those who have been wronged and willingness to forgive by those who have been wronged.'

A significant proportion of the conflict or peace process coverage in Nagaland is also through primary texts, or the actual speeches and writings of the actors involved, often reproduced in full. One consequence of this is that newspapers become an unmediated medium, with the framing, which is frequently theological, remaining intact. For instance The Naga Forum for Reconciliation comprising of apex tribal bodies and organizations, set up in February 2008, uses newspapers to communicate its goals. In February 2009 when the Forum organised the Naga Convention for Reconciliation and Hope, the Forum's convenor Wati Aier made a speech which was carried in full by local newspapers, and which set out thus, his exhortation to all Nagas.

The FNR greets each of you in the name of our Lord and savior Jesus Christ!

On this momentous day, I humbly stand before the Naga people with awe:

' That God is sovereign and Lord of all nations and peoples and powerfully present in our midst!

' That the Naga spirit is alive and kicking! Your presence here this morning proves it all.

' I am in awe, to realize that the future of the Nagas is right here, at our disposal to be ushered in by the Nagas themselves!

Therefore, this is a decisive moment for us. What we decide here is going to be important. Let no one go away from here without making a fresh commitment to the Naga cause, indeed to our destiny.

When Aier is given conventional reporting treatment however, it comes across like this:

According to the forum's convener, Rev. Dr. Wati Aier, the Naga Convention for Reconciliation and Peace will be a time for the Nagas to look at the current difficulties and 'trying to figure out as to where do we go from here'.

The meeting will dwell on reconciliation while also acknowledging and supporting the Naga political talks, on with the centre. 'We are not saying that the talks (Indo-Naga talks) should stop and reconciliation must happen. But we want that both the talks and reconciliation must be given equal emphasis' Dr. Aier said. (Morung Express, 24 February, 2009)

It could be argued therefore that from an activist peace journalism point of view a Naga newspaper is being a more effective instrument for peace when it is functioning as an unmediated platform, rather than when it is practicing journalism.

#### **Has the Government of India abandoned the INDO-NAGA Peace talks?**

With renewed vigour we have started 2010. But for the buzz of expediting the peace talks between the Government of India and the Government of Nagalim, so the long standing conflict can come to a much desired final conclusion,. How sincere is India ? The Nagas want an honourable ending to the conflict, one which portrays and secures mutual respect. Though, according to both parties the year 2009 promised to bring a breakthrough, only one not very positive round of talks was held. In fact the Government of India during the talks held in Zurich , Switzerland , backtracked on its proposal to be unveiled their determining it a 'misunderstanding'.

After this last meeting between the two nations nothing happened. An indication for a change in approach, attitude or direction came with the replacement of the decade long interlocutor for the peace talks Mr. Padmanabhaiah and the repeatedly expressed 'condition' that talks should be held within the constitution of India .

In September 2009 Home Secretary G.K. Pillai announced that the Government of India was working on a proposal to solve the conflict. He made it also known that this Government of India's proposal would be discussed and negotiated 'within the constitution of India '.

By December 2009 the leadership of Nagaland had not received this proposal though Home Secretary G.K. Pillai through the press stated that the negotiator for the Nation Nagalim was expected to be in Delhi after carefully reading the text of the proposal.

While in Amsterdam Mr. Th. Muivah, the chief negotiator of Nagalim told NISC that neither a proposal had been received from the Government of India nor were the Nagas officially approached to agree on coming to Delhi for the next round of talks. He also said that 'it is not customary to communicate through the press as it is not the highest level which was agreed upon at the onset of the ceasefire and peace talks'.

Note: ***The Talks are being held unconditionally, at the highest level and in a third country.***

Since it has repeatedly negated at least two of these points of the ceasefire agreement and does not show signs of taking the talks for peace seriously the Naga International Support Center calls on the Government of India and urges it to:

- **publish its policy on the Indo- Naga conflict so that it can truly be accountable to the people of this largest democracy in the world called India**
- **be sincere in following up what has been agreed and to lift the financial burden from the back of India 's populace**
- **honour its agreements to the point of becoming credible and trustworthy**

Neither ordinary Nagas nor ordinary Indians want war and by recognizing the 'unique history and situation of the Nagas the Government of India acknowledged the history of the Naga Nation only became part of the Indian sub continent because of the British colonization. The Nagas have every right to free as it is India which denies the Nagas the Right to Self Determination.
