


8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

As an entity of the Executive branch of the Republic of Ambazonia, APEC utilizes meetings, demonstrations, campaigns for membership, lobbying of US government and others in propagating the total independence of Ambazonia from Cameroon Republic's illegal annexation since 1961. APEC also supports its members and citizens of Ambazonia in and out of the United States in the quest for political asylum, and also plan to demand full Temporary Protective Status for all Ambazonian nationals entering the United States of America. APEC also lobbies other international Organs, especially the United Nations for the independence of Ambazonia.

1. Peaceful Demonstrations: So far, limited to the British Embassy in Washington D.C, APEC leads its members and even sympathizers who include US citizens in demanding the support of the British and American governments for the total independence of Ambazonia.
2. Public Meetings: To discuss possible strategies and also educate the public on what is going on in the diplomacy and legal pursuits of Ambazonia Republic. We sometimes distribute tracts and other important legal documents.
3. Lobbying Activities: APEC lobbies foreign entities, especially Members of the U.S. Congress and Senate, other foreign diplomats and professors in academia. Hopefully just as the Free South Africa Movement or the many pro-democratic movements which have been nurtured by the American Dream, that of Ambazonia will also take root and succeed. We strongly hold the position that most conflicts today are a result of the Denial of Justice to aggrieved peoples in violation of their known and protected inalienable rights.
