Dear Ainsley:

Thank you for retaining Patton Boggs LLP to work with Ainsley Gill & Associates, LLC (hereinafter referred to as AGA) on trade issues and security issues in connection with AGA's representation of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago in Washington, D.C. We look forward to working with you on this engagement. The term of this engagement, beginning on January 15, 2005 will be for the duration of 12 months, through January 15, 2006. The engagement will automatically renew for another six months through July 15, 2006, unless you notify us in writing by December 1, 2005 if AGA intends not to renew.

To ensure that we have a common understanding of the terms of our representation and to comply with the rules of professional conduct for the jurisdictions in which we practice, I have enclosed a statement describing the standard terms of engagement for legal services to be provided by Patton Boggs LLP. The terms of engagement cover such matters as our procedure for handling potential conflicts of interest, fees, costs and expenses, billing arrangements and terms of payment. Please review the document carefully to ensure that it comports with your understanding. This letter supplements and modifies the enclosed terms of engagement.

Frank Samolis and I will be primarily responsible for the work done on behalf of AGA in support of AGA's representation of the Government of Trinidad and Tobago, and will supervise Patton Boggs lawyers and other professionals who may work on this project under our direction. I anticipate that associates, staff attorneys, legal assistants, specialists and/or in-house consultants will assist in the matter.

Our legal fees will be a set retainer of \$45,000 per month, including fees and disbursements, payable quarterly in advance. Work will commence upon receipt of the first quarter payment.

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The succeeding quarter's retainer will be due in advance before the beginning of that quarter. Pre-approved travel expenses outside of Washington will be billed to AGA in addition to the set retainer.

Patton Boggs will register as required with the U.S. Department of Justice its representation of AGA on behalf of AGA's representation for the Government of Trinidad and Tobago.

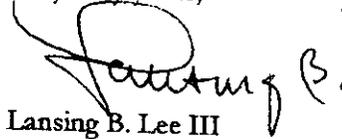
Patton Boggs shall submit monthly reports to AGA consisting of work completed, current activities and projected activities for the next month.
