On behalf of my client, The Government of Trinidad and Tobago, I would like to request a meeting between you and the Honorable Patrick Manning, Prime Minister of Trinidad and Tobago.

Prime Minister Manning seeks to use this discussion to reciprocate the visit by the Congressman to Trinidad and Tobago and further strengthen the relations between the United States and Trinidad and Tobago.

We believe that this requested meeting is in America's strong national interest due to the surging regional importance of Trinidad & Tobago as a result of its assertive political leadership, strong economy, significant energy reserves and pivotal geographic location.

Additionally, in the wake of the recent terrorist plot involving Trinidadian and Guyanese citizens to blow up the gas pipe lines at New York JFK Airport and more aggressive regional overtures from China and Venezuela in the last year, the importance of enhancing our close relationship with Trinidad & Tobago has become even more vital. Currently, Trinidad & Tobago produces up to 80% of the liquefied natural gas (LNG) consumed in the United States and is the most powerful economy in the Caribbean. Further, Prime Minister Manning has made it clear that establishing a personal rapport with the Congressman is paramount to his interest in pursuing greater trade and military cooperation with the United States.

A meeting with Prime Minister Manning, who is likely to lead his nation for the foreseeable future, would also signal support for his Administration and further encourage pro-US policymaking on the part of other CARICOM leaders on issues such as constructive intervention in Haiti, opposition to Venezuelan efforts to undermine US regional influence and coordination of efforts to interdict drug trafficking and combat terrorism.

If you were able to meet with Prime Minister Manning during his trip to Washington from June 19 through June 21, it would be very much appreciated. Background Information for meeting with H.E. Marina Valere, Ambassador to Trinidad and Tobago in Washington

In 2006, Prime Minister Manning met with Vice President Cheney, Homeland Security Director Chertoff and Secretary of State Condoleeza Rice in an effort to strengthen diplomatic, economic and military ties. The Prime Minister met with President Bush at the White House in December 2003. The Prime Minister addressed members of the Congressional Caribbean Caucus and the Congressional Black Caucus in Nov 2006. (Rep. Donald Payne, Diane Watson, Barbara Lee were some of the members that were in attendance).

Better relations with Trinidad and Tobago are in America's strong national interest due to the surging regional importance of Trinidad & Tobago as a result of its assertive political leadership, strong economy, significant energy reserves and pivotal geographic location. Trinidad and Tobago was the author of the International Criminal Court and can play a significant role in the restoration of military assistance to CARICOM. In 2006, Trinidad & Tobago held the chairmanship of CARICOM and hosted a regional security conference as well as a leading regional energy conference. In addition to hosting portions of the 2007 World Cricket Cup, the country has announced its intention to play host to at least two other major regional policy conferences in the coming year, although it has yet to specify the events. Trinidad and Tobago will host the next Summit of the Americas.

Additionally, in the wake of more aggressive regional overtures from China and Venezuela in the last year, the importance of enhancing our close relationship with Trinidad & Tobago has become even more vital. Currently, Trinidad & Tobago produces up to 80% of the liquefied natural gas (LNG) consumed in the United States and is the most powerful economy in the Caribbean. Further, Prime Minister Manning has made it clear that establishing a personal rapport with members of Congress is paramount to Trinidad and Tobago's interest in pursuing greater trade and military cooperation with the United States.

As the leading economy in CARICOM, Trinidad & Tobago seeks to be instrumental in negotiating a CARICOM Free Trade Agreement. The US and the Caribbean Community have recently begun to consider the possibility of negotiating a free trade agreement to improve the region's access to the US market. A delegation of CARICOM foreign and trade ministers raised the issue of an FTA in April, 2006 during a meeting with former US Trade Representative Rob Portman. Trinidad and Tobago and with the guidance of the Ambassador could further this regional trade initiative.

Deportation is another very important issue for Trinidad and Tobago and the entire CARICOM region. There have been many meetings with US State Department officials regarding deportation of foreign nationals back to their country of birth for minor infractions. In raising this issue with State Department officials the Caribbean diplomatic community has not been successful, to date. The US Department of State's position is that there is no documented factual basis for the allegations put forth by the CARICOM

community that deportation is hurting their fragile societies. Trinidad and the rest of their Caribbean neighbors have agreed to undertake independent studies on this issue.
