Guantanamo Families Applaud Decision to Lend Magna Carta to the United States

*Kuwaiti Family Committee Calls for Historic Document to Remain at National Archives until
Habeas Corpus is Restored at Guantanamo*

Washington, DC – In light of continued indefinite detentions at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, the Kuwaiti Family Committee today applauded the news that winning Magna Carta bidder David Rubenstein will lend the historic document to the United States. The Committee also called for the document to remain on display at the National Archives until the rule of law and the writ of habeas corpus enshrined in Magna Carta are restored at Guantanamo. The Bush Administration has abandoned the document's principles, according to the Committee, which hopes that its continued display in the U.S. will raise awareness of the country's founding principles.

Yesterday evening, Rubenstein paid \$21.3 million at a Sotheby's auction in New York City to secure what is believed to be one of seventeen remaining copies of the Magna Carta in existence. The 1297 document – considered the "birth certificate of freedom" – guaranteed the rights of trial by jury and protections against unlawful imprisonment. These protections have been denied to detainees at Guantanamo for more than six years,

Khalid Al-Odah, head of the Kuwaiti Family Committee and father of Guantanamo detainee Fawzi Al-Odah, hopes that keeping the document on display in the United States will hasten the United States' return to the time-tested principles of modern democracies that it has abandoned at Guantanamo.

"The Magna Carta is a founding statement of basic human rights that nearly one-third of the civilized world follows," said Al Odah. "All I want is for the United States to restore these rights, particularly the right to habeas corpus, so that my son and other detainees may challenge their detentions before a neutral judge."

The 800-year old right to habeas corpus is an enduring legacy of the Magna Carta. Early next year, the Supreme Court is expected to rule on whether the detainees have a right to habeas corpus that Congress cannot take away.

"With significant questions about the fundamental rights of individuals coming to a head this year, the United States needs the wisdom of the Magna Carta now more than ever," said Al Odah.

In conjunction with Bush's visit, the Kuwaiti Family Committee will call on the Bush Administration to either immediately provide the remaining Kuwaiti detainees with fair hearings before neutral judges or release them from the detention facility.

Twelve Kuwaitis were originally taken to Guantanamo Bay following the U.S. invasion of Afghanistan. In 2005 and 2006, eight of the detainees were returned to Kuwait where they were charged, tried and cleared of wrongdoing by Kuwaiti courts. Despite the best efforts of the Government of Kuwait, four Kuwaitis remain imprisoned without any explanation, including Fawzi Al Odah, the son of Kuwaiti Family Committee head Khalid Al Odah.

Kuwaiti Family Committee Urges Release of Kuwaiti Detainees at Guantanamo Bay as President Bush Visits

Six Years After Prisoners First Arrived at Guantanamo, Four Kuwaiti Loved Ones Still Being Held Without Explanation

WASHINGTON, DC – On the occasion of President Bush’s visit to Kuwait and on the sixth anniversary of the first prisoners arriving at Guantanamo Bay, Cuba, the Kuwaiti Family Committee today called on the United States to release the remaining four Kuwaiti detainees still imprisoned at the detention facility to the custody of the Government of Kuwait.

“Kuwait and its people have done everything America has asked of them. We have remained faithful as an ally to the United States and as a friend to the American people,” said Khalid Al Odah, head of the Kuwaiti Family Committee and father of detainee Fawzi Al-Odah.”

“Mr. President, it’s time to trust the State of Kuwait as your faithful ally and to return my son and the other three Kuwaitis to face justice in their own country. Please send Fawzi and the other Kuwaitis home now.”

Kuwaiti Family Committee Lawyers File Emergency Petition to Protect Attorney-Client Privilege

*Email message from Chief Guantanamo Prosecutor reveals intentions to
circumvent military and professional rules of legal conduct*

WASHINGTON, DC – Attorneys for Fawzi al-Odah and three other Kuwaiti detainees held at Guantanamo Bay filed an emergency petition with the U.S. Court of Military Commission Review yesterday afternoon seeking to block military prosecutors from contacting four Kuwaiti detainees without their attorneys' consent. The attorneys' petition for a writ of mandamus – or other appropriate order – comes amid concerns that military prosecutors have violated, or intend to violate, military and professional rules of legal conduct.

Last month, in an email exchange with Kuwaiti Family Committee attorney Matthew MacLean, Chief Guantanamo Prosecutor Lawrence Morris asserted that he and his staff are entitled to communicate directly with the four Kuwaiti detainees without their attorneys' consent. "Government can certainly have communications with your client on commissions-related issues independent of your representation of them," Morris wrote in an email message.

Morris's assertion violates both military and professional rules of legal conduct, including the Army Rules of Professional Responsibility for Lawyers and the American Bar Association's rules of professional conduct. Additionally, such contact would cause irreparable harm to the detainees' relationships with their attorneys, the petition argues.

The remaining four Kuwaiti detainees at Guantanamo have been imprisoned for six years with essentially no contact with friends, family members or others in their lives. As their legal advocates and primary contacts with the outside world, the detainees' trust in their attorneys and the attorney-client bond is crucial not only for the detainees' legal affairs, but also for their health and well-being. "That trust must be protected zealously," the attorneys wrote in the petition.

"This petition will test whether the professional rules of ethics that govern all attorneys will be applied to the military commission prosecutors at Guantanamo," said David Cynamon, lead attorney for the Kuwaiti Family Committee. "The Chief Military Prosecutor's refusal to acknowledge those ethical obligations further undermines the credibility of a process that is already heavily tilted in favor of the government."

Morris's e-mail is the latest in a series of government efforts to undermine the attorney-client relationship between the Kuwaiti detainees and their lawyers. On previous occasions, interrogators have told the Kuwaiti detainees, "Don't trust your lawyers. ... Did you know your lawyers are Jews?" Last year, Defense Department official Charles "Cully" Stimson was forced to resign after he called for a boycott of a list of law firms representing Guantanamo detainees, including the law firm for the Kuwaiti detainees, Pillsbury Winthrop Shaw Pittman.

Concerns about unauthorized contact with detainees initially arose from discussions on a separate and currently unresolved issue – which two of the four remaining Kuwaiti detainees may be charged by the military commissions.

During his trip to the Middle East in January, President Bush said that two of the four Kuwaitis would be charged, but did not state which ones. Attorney Matthew MacLean contacted Lawrence Morris seeking clarification in January and, after a series of obfuscations by Morris over a matter of weeks, the conversation turned into a dispute over whether prosecutors could contact MacLean's clients without permission. To date, the Administration has not answered the precipitating question – which two detainees are being charged.

At first, there were 12 Kuwaitis in Guantanamo Bay. In 2005 and 2006, the United States returned eight of them to Kuwait, where that country's courts charged, tried and cleared them of wrongdoing. They are now home with their families, rebuilding their lives. Currently, Fawzi al-Odah and three other Kuwaitis remain imprisoned.
