ITEM 10:

Membership and Organization

Sunshine Coalition of Uzbekistan is a non-governmental organization dedicated to building democracy and supporting reform in the Republic of Uzbekistan. It was founded in Tashkent on April 21, 2005 and, as required by Uzbek law, registered with the Ministry of Justice as a Social Organization on July 25. In May and June, the Sunshine Coalition of Uzbekistan held two open membership conferences in Tashkent. The coalition's current membership includes 14 organizations, including the Free Peasants Party, the Agrarian Entrepreneur's Party and the Association of Women Entrepreneurs. Sunshine Coalition of Uzbekistan is governed by a Board of Directors composed of leaders from the democracy and human rights movement and organizations. Dr. Sanjar G. Umarov was elected as Chairman of the coalition on May 24, 2005. The composition of the Board of Directors and a biography of Dr. Umarov are attached hereto.

5. There is no formal agreement between the foreign principal and the registrant. All directions for the programs were undertaken by or with instructions from Dr. Sanjar Umarov, Chairman of the Foreign Principal. Dr. Umarov is an Uzbek citizen and a U.S. Permanent resident residing in Germantown, Tennessee. Dr. Umarov personally has led the efforts of the foreign principal and the registrant.
6. There is no formal agreement between the foreign principal and the registrant. All directions for the programs were undertaken by Sanjar Umarov, Chairman of the Foreign Principal. Dr. Umarov is an Uzbek citizen and a U.S. Permanent resident residing in Germantown, Tennessee. Dr. Umarov personally has led the efforts of the foreign principal and the registrant.
7. The Registrant is authorized to undertake efforts to submit grant proposals and other efforts to fund the programs described in this Registration. Currently, two (2) grant proposals have been submitted to the National Endowment for Democracy (NED) for funding of the Economic Advisory Council and the Rule of Law Program. The nature and method of performance is described in each of those Proposals.
8. The Registrant intends to undertake the following activities on behalf of the Foreign Principal:

Sunshine Coalition of Uzbekistan and Sunshine Uzbekistan USA, NFP have a unique role to play by providing sometimes-competing stakeholders with a forum for developing responses to the crises facing Uzbekistan today. In cooperation with local coalition members, Sunshine Uzbekistan USA, NFP has developed several initiatives to assist in the development of local civil organizations and in the delivery of programmatic responses that address crisis issues.

Economic Advisory Council

Sunshine Uzbekistan's Economic Advisory Council is charged with assisting the coalition develop a comprehensive reform program that addresses the economic basis of the inter-related crises facing Uzbekistan today. The Advisory Council will assist coalition leaders in prioritizing responses to Uzbekistan's crises and developing reform policy proposals. The Advisory Council will be supported by a small staff of local economists, academicians and former government officials who will provide perspective on current economic conditions, summarize existing reform plans and develop potential policy positions. In partnership with the George Washington University Elliott School of International Relations, Sunshine Uzbekistan USA, NFP shall coordinate the activities undertaken by the EAC.

Rule of Law

Human rights activists, small businessmen and peasant farmers are all routine victims of a legal system dedicated to protecting the personal interests of government officials. Sunshine Uzbekistan's Rule of Law initiative seeks to provide immediate legal assistance to individuals unjustly jailed, develop a documented case load of unjust prosecutions, provide training to defense attorneys and develop a judicial reform

program. In partnership with the Chicago Kent College of Law, Sunshine Uzbekistan USA, NFP is working to develop a Rule of Law initiative designed specifically to train Uzbek lawyers to handle human rights cases and defend actions by the Government of Uzbekistan against victims of oppression (political and otherwise) within Uzbekistan.

Leadership Training

The current regime's efforts to suffocate political opposition have made it dangerous for activists to meet and develop common programs and share organizing strategies. Sunshine Uzbekistan USA, NFP is working towards developing with the National Democratic Institute a series of out-of-country training seminars for leaders of the democratic movement.

Election Observers

Sunshine Uzbekistan and coalition member the Association of Women Entrepreneurs are currently developing a "train the trainers" program for independent election observers in conjunction with the League of Women's Voters. The program envisions out of country "train-the-trainers" training for three groups of 15, to be followed by in country locally led training of 2,000 observers.

Cotton Reform and Crop Substitution

Over 70% of Uzbekistan's citizen's are directly dependent on the government controlled cotton production system. Sunshine Uzbekistan and coalition member the Free Peasants Party are working with the [Cotton Department] of the Mississippi State University on the development of an agricultural finance program that will encourage the growth of alternative crops by providing farmers with credit resources outside of the state controlled cotton production system.

Child Labor

The vast majority of Uzbek children miss significant schooling because they are required, often times by school administrators, to work in the cotton fields. Sunshine Uzbekistan and coalition member the Union of Agrarian Entrepreneurs are working with the AFL-CIO's Solidarity Center to develop a program that will discourage the use of child labor in the cotton fields.

9. Political Activities of Registrant:

The Political Activities of the Registrant are to influence and communicate with various members of government, including individuals within the executive and legislative branches of the federal government, to support the enactment of legislation and the policies which support the mission statement of the Sunshine Coalition of Uzbekistan, and to seek appropriations in support of such reforms, which include:

To unite all registered and unregistered social, economic and political groups that support the establishment of democracy and the respect of human rights.

To open and sustain a dialogue with the current regime about ending Uzbekistan's continuing political and economic crises.

To develop a comprehensive program of social, economic and political reforms for adoption by the Government of Uzbekistan.

To support the development of local civil organizations by building bridges between domestic human rights and reform organizations with appropriate international counter-parts.

The means employed to achieve this purpose is to engage strategic counsel, federal lobbying, media relations, contact with non-governmental organizations, governmental organizations, academe, religious communities, and private fund-raising. Assisting coalition members develop local, democracy building programs with U.S. counterparts. Informing supporters of democracy and human rights of the challenges and opportunities coalition members encounter as they strive to build a democratic Uzbekistan.
