

ATHLETES FROM AROUND THE WORLD GEAR UP FOR THE JERUSALEM INTERNATIONAL MARATHON, MARCH 25


New York - January 27, 2011: Athletes and travelers from around the world will travel to Israel to compete in the first-ever Jerusalem International Marathon, March 25.

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

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

ISRAEL TO HOST TWO INTERNATIONAL CYCLING COMPETITIONS THIS SPRING

New York - February 10, 2011: Israel will play host to two international cycling competitions this spring, showcasing the unique and diverse terrain of this small Mediterranean nation. The two tours include:

- **Tour de Dead Sea** (March 5): Taking travelers through the moon-like landscape of the lowest point on earth, the Tour de Dead Sea will attract more than 1,000 cyclists from around the world to ride along the contours of the Dead Sea in support of its candidacy as a finalist in the New7Wonders of Nature Competition.

Cyclists will be able to choose between 3-, 15-, 27- or 40-mile routes around the Dead Sea region with passage through Beit Ha'Arava, the King Abdullah Bridge and Qasr el Yahud-the site on the Jordan River where Jesus was believed to have been baptized. In addition, the 40-mile course will also pass through the Dragot Cliffs and over the He'Etekim Cliffs down to Kalia Beach.



- **Tour d'Israel** (March 7-10, March 30-April 2): The Tour d'Israel, Israel's country-wide cycling event, will provide unrivaled views of Israel's diverse landscape with two challenging bicycle courses.

- The tour's 380-mile on-road race will begin at Mount Hermon in the North and pass through the Galilee region, Masada, Nazareth and the Sea Galilee, Jerusalem, Beersheba, the Jordan Valley, Masada and the Dead Sea with a finish line at the seaside resort town of Eilat on the shores of the Red Sea, March 7-10.
- For the more adventurous rider, the 224-mile off-road course will begin in the northern Golan Heights and include a four-mile climb finishing at the southern tip of the Carmel Forest mountain range, March 30-April 2.


HAIFA HOSTS MULTIFAITH "HOLIDAY OF HOLIDAYS" FESTIVAL THROUGH DECEMBER 2010

Toronto - December 1, 2010: Beginning on December 3, the Northern Israeli city of Haifa will play host to the "Holiday of Holidays" festival--a month-long celebration featuring four consecutive weekends filled with Chanukah, Christmas and Eid al-Adha themed-activities.



The main attraction of the festival, "Neighbors," will feature sculptures, paintings and installations documenting the lives of Jewish, Christian and Muslim residents in an open-air style exhibition throughout Haifa. The display will begin at the Beit HaGefen Center and spread into the alleyways, gardens, courtyards and stone walls of the city's Wadi Nisnas neighborhood, and feature works by multi-generational Israeli and international artists.

The festival will also present various events throughout the culturally diverse neighborhoods in Haifa, including a photography exhibition by Ziv Koren at the Haifa City Museum and various city bus stations; live musical performances in the Wadi Nisnas and German Colony districts; a Christmas tree-lined boulevard with festive lights and decorations; and an antiques fair; and an international writers' convention. The festival will also provide travelers with free entry to all museums around the city on Fridays and Saturdays.



"The Holiday of Holiday Festivals is a one-of-a-kind event that will celebrate the diverse cultures throughout Haifa," says Oded Grofman, Consul for Tourism, Israel Government Tourist Office - Canada. "And will provide some additional excitement for travelers arriving in the port town this December."

Also, the festival will include 18 liturgy music concerts at various churches throughout the city, including a performance by Israeli and international artists at the Yochanan HaMatbil New Greek Orthodox Church, as well as a National Antiques fair in the halls of Beit HaGefen and an arts and crafts fair in Wadi Nisnas.

The weekends will also feature a culinary festival offering *prix fixe* menu options and specials at some of Jerusalem's leading restaurants, cafes and pubs.



"HARRY POTTER" GRAVESITE DRAWS TOURISTS TO RAMLE, ISRAEL
