**ACTIVITIES UNDER CONTRACT WITH THE DEPARTMENT OF TRADE &  
INDUSTRY, REPUBLIC OF THE PHILIPPINES**

Political activities for the Department of Trade and Industry, Republic of the Philippines, during this period involved the following:

(1) Advocacy efforts on behalf of Congressional support of the SAVE Our Industries Act (H.R. 2387 & S. 1244 of the 112<sup>th</sup> Congress), which would expand textile and apparel trade between the United States and the Philippines. This included the scheduling of meetings in the Congress and with Administration officials for Philippines officials, and Filipino and U.S. private sector interests in support of the SAVE Act, and the preparation of materials for such meetings.

(2) Support for the Philippines Government and private sector representatives in engaging the United States on labor issues relevant for bilateral trade relations, including the SAVE Act, by providing input and memoranda to the delegation on positions for such engagement, and discussing the issues with Congressional staff, and non-governmental organizations and trade unions, and the Philippine private sector interests.

(3) Support activities for the effort of the Philippines Government and private sector to conduct outreach to the Filipino-American community for the purpose of promoting the Community's engagement with Congress on the SAVE Act.

(4) Scheduling and briefing support for the visit of a Philippines government delegation to Washington in April 2012. The delegation of April 18-19, 2012 was led by Secretary Alberto del Rosario of the Department of Foreign Affairs. The delegation met with Congressional offices.

(5) Scheduling and briefing support in preparation for the visit of a Philippines government delegation to Washington in June 2012.

These efforts involved assisting in the scheduling of meetings, the preparation of materials, the analysis of trade data, and providing technical assistance related to the drafting of the legislation and its potential implementation.
