

Menominee Delegation Goes to Kurdistan

A delegation of three Menominee leaders and three tribal members have embarked on a cultural exchange trip to Kurdistan, located in war-torn northern Iraq, according to an article published by the Shawano Leader on June 16.

This is the Menominee's first foray into international relations, the Leader reported, and it was prompted by an invitation from a Kurd representative who traveled to the tribe's Wisconsin reservation last fall.

As a cultural exchange visit, delegation members will meet with regional governmental leaders, tour archeological sites, visit Kurdish colleges, where they will perform traditional Menominee songs and dances. They will also discuss potential joint business ventures.

The delegation left on Wednesday and will return on June 23.

Menominee delegation going on cultural exchange in Kurdistan

KESHENA — The Menominee Tribe's first foray into international relations will take them to the other side of the world to a country that has endured years of tyranny and war.

A delegation of three Menominee leaders and three tribal members will embark on a cultural exchange trip to Kurdistan, the northernmost province in war-torn Iraq.

Menominee Tribal Legislative member and Kurdistan Planning Committee chairman Ken Fish said the invitation to visit Kurdistan came after Kurd representatives visited the Menominee Reservation last October.

"They were impressed with the fact that we retained our culture after so many years of assimilation," Fish said. "I think it's important that we understand each other's history. So often we as indigenous people see all these events going on all over the world, and sometimes you don't get the real story unless you actually meet and speak with the indigenous people of the area."

The Menominee delegation will leave Chicago O'Hare International Airport at 2:30 p.m. Wednesday for Frankfurt, Germany then go on to the Kurdish city of Erbil. The delegation will return on June 23.

The trip will be a cultural exchange. The delegation will meet with the regional governmental leaders of Kurdistan, tour archeological sites, visit Kurdish colleges to perform traditional Menominee song and dance and to discuss the possibility of joint business ventures. However, due to security reasons, Fish said the exact details of their itinerary will remain unknown until their arrival.

"This is a goodwill trip," Fish said. "Hopefully we can establish a partnership for the future in terms of cultural exchange and hopefully an economic partnership."

Ranging across northern Iraq, the Iraqi Kurds are apart of a larger Kurdish population that inhabits a wide area from eastern Turkey and the northwestern part of Syria. With a population of 4 million, the Kurdish area of northern Iraq is has remained relatively unscathed by the chaos that has obliterated much of the economic infrastructure in southern Iraq. In recent years, Kurdistan has established itself as an influential economic entity touting a burgeoning tourism industry.

The historic enmity between Kurds and the central Arab government in Baghdad has contributed to the determined survival of the Kurdish culture, with their most significant and most binding cultural characteristic being the Kurdish language, a similarity that Fish sees with the Menominee tribe's history.

"When they visited our reservation, I got the sense that they were amazed that we haven't been totally assimilated into mainstream society after all these years, that we maintain our culture, language and traditions and that vision of who we are, and I think that's one of the reasons we were invited to go over there."

Although relatively isolated from the violence in southern Iraq, the northern Kurdish area is still perilous for westerners. The Menominee delegation will be attached to a security detail wherever they go, but the potential danger is not lost on the Menominee representatives.

Legislator Rebecca Alegria recognizes the danger involved, but she said the potential for cultural exchange and possible joint business opportunities are worth the traversing the region.

"There is an element of risk, but there's too much potential for both our people to benefit from this," she said. "This is a chance to establish the Menominee on the world's stage, so it's worth it."

Members of the group are excited regardless of the peril involved and have carefully packed their traditional Menominee regalia and some traditional gifts to present to their Kurdish hosts like wild rice, birch bark baskets, maple syrup, blankets and lacrosse sticks.

For one of the group's members, representing the Menominee Tribe internationally is nothing new. Having traveled extensively throughout Europe with various Native American dance troupes, Marla Mahkimetas said she has no idea what to expect going to a region with a war torn legacy, but she is looking forward to the experience.

"I love meeting people from other cultures," she said. "It's broadening my perspective on their people and the world. By exchanging cultures, we're opening up the door to new relationships and friendships. I hope this trip will be a positive step in that direction."
