

AGREEMENT BETWEEN THE PERMANENT OBSERVER MISSION OF THE STATE OF PALESTINE TO THE UNITED NATIONS AND INDEPENDENT DIPLOMAT

1. Independent Diplomat ("ID") will assist the Permanent Observer Mission of the State of Palestine to the United Nations ("the Mission") with its diplomatic outreach and strategy for a period of one year from the date of signing of this contract.

2. This work will comprise three principal elements:

- (a) support to the Mission in gathering information and views of Member States;
- (b) advice on strategies and tactics for handling the work in New York; and
- (c) assistance with diplomatic tools including, but not limited to preparation for meetings, letters, briefings.

3. Upon the signing of this contract, the Mission and ID shall notify one another of the individual(s) to whom each shall report.

4. ID will work in confidence with the Mission and will not advise or otherwise act for any other party involved in the Israel-Palestine conflict. The Mission shall provide ID with information necessary to enable ID to perform its work.

5. The Mission understands and accepts that the information and advice provided to it by ID should be treated in strictest confidence. ID shall not disclose prior, during or subsequent to this Agreement, any confidential information of the Mission, except as required in connection with ID's performance of this Agreement or as required by law.

6. ID will not advise or work for clients who promote or advocate unlawful violence or who otherwise engage in unethical behaviour. ID reserves the right to withdraw from this project on these grounds at any time.
