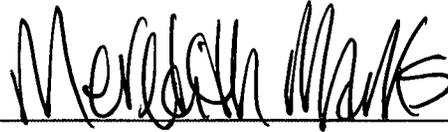

Princess Haya Bint Al Hussein

Registrant facilitated an interview with the New York Times for Princess Haya for a story that profiled her in connection with the World Equestrian Games in Kentucky. Registrant handled logistics for the interview and responded to follow-up questions from the reporter. The story did not relate to politics or public policy and registrant's work did not involve any contacts with the US government.

Rosia Montana Gold Corporation SA

Registrant pitched an interview for a Deutsche Weld reporter with executives from Gabriel Resources, the parent company for foreign entity Rosia Montana Gold Corporation. However, Gabriel Resources canceled the interview and the interview never happened.

Registrant assisted in the coordination with a Bloomberg reporter working on a profile of Tom Kaplan. A Bloomberg contact in Bucharest visited the mine to gather a few insights for the story. However, the registrant never had direct contact with the Bucharest contact.

Registrant also listened in on a client call and provided news updates to a reporter via e-mail.

Euro-parliamentarians To Debate Cyanide Issue. Banning Cyanide Or Exploit Gold?

On Wednesday, May 5, the European Parliament will vote on a Joint Resolution submitted by four parliamentary groups, to ban technologies based on cyanide in the European Union. The stakes are huge.

Although the resolution is neither binding nor has any legal force, the signal sent out by the EU could affect the balance in the case of mining projects in several EU-member states, including Rosia Montana.

Although the authors of the Resolution include members of all big parliamentary groups, several Romanian MEPs, including Elena Basescu, Marian-Jean Marinescu or Cristian Preda, are trying to introduce amendments likely to significantly dilute the message of the conference.

The Resolution on banning the use of cyanide in mining was signed by MEPs from all political groups, from several EU countries. The signatories include Chris Davies, ALDE environmental coordinator, Suzana Roithova, permanent member in the European Parliament's standing bureau and also Romanian MEPs like Renate Weber or Daciana Sarbu.

The Resolution says that cyanide is extremely toxic and that its use could trigger irreversible catastrophes affecting health, the environment and biodiversity. The document lists 15 reasons why such technologies should be banned.

The report also mentions the legislation forbidding the use of such technologies in Germany or Hungary and proposes a total ban on the use of cyanide in mining across the EU territory.

The Resolution also urges the EU member states to discourage the use of such technologies on their territories.

However, there are several Romanian MEPs who would like to amend the text of the document and who want a less drastic resolution.

These MEPs - Marian-Jean MARINESCU, Elena BASESCU, Petru Constantin LUHAN, Cristian, Dan PREDA, Traian UNGUREANU and Iosif MATULA - want to scrap paragraph number four in the Resolution that asks the member states not to support such technologies. In a separate amendment, they ask for an analysis on whether such technology should be banned in the EU. Sources with the European Parliament told us that other Romanian MEPs from other political groups would also endorse those amendments. Cristian Preda said that Adina Valean and Gigi Becali were also among the 42 signatories.

Other interesting remarks made by the sources refer to the support given to these amendments by Euromines. All documents sent by e-mail to MEPs are actually headed with the Euromines logo. Renate Weber said that she hoped that the Resolution would be cleared in its present form, as, she said, the document had enjoyed a majority support several days ago. She also said that there are rumours suggesting the existence of a "wild lobby" being carried out among the MEPs who are in favour of the resolution, in order to discourage them from supporting the document.

Renate Weber also said that she had contacted the office of Janos Eder, member of the EP's standing bureau, and asked him to call for a nominal vote.

"It is absolutely natural to know who is voting and how is voting in the case of such a vital resolution," she said. Cristian Preda said that the suggested amendments amounted to

"common sense". "We ask for an assessment, an analyses of the situation, having in mind the fact that at this moment in time there is a European legislation that functions. Such a resolution, as it is now in its current form, puts a question mark on the future of Europe's mining sector."

When asked if the PPE group was directly endorsing the stand of the European mining sector, as it results from the emails sent by the MEPs with the PPE, Cristian Preda said that "the mining industry in Europe is more entitled to have an opinion on the issue, unlike Renate Weber or Daciana Sarbu. They (miners) are the ones who have the expertise, not those radical ecologists. it would be good to see those MEPs presenting their opinions in public, namely the position of being cautious and starving."

Preda said that his group was still expected to discuss the problem, so no decision had been taken yet on the issue. Asked whether the amendments suggested (by his group) were related to Rosia Montana, Preda said that he would support any mine using cyanide, irrespective of its location.

The "Roşia Montană" project has received a new urbanism certificate. The environmental permit follows, based on which the gold can be extracted as of 2011.

Roşia Montană Gold Corporation (RMGC) obtained, at the end of last week, a new urbanism certificate which opened its way to an environmental permit that would enable the start of the mining exploitation as of next year, most probably.

Yesterday, while the Environment officials announced the restart of the permitting process for the project from Rosia Montana, the European Parliament adopted a Resolution recommending the EU Member States not to support any mining project involving the use of cyanides.

"The EP vote has no legal effect and does not change the legislation applicable to EU mining. (...) The Roşia Montană project is the most complex industrial project in Romania in the last 20 years and brings thousands of jobs and over four billion USD in the economy, in a time of crisis", explained the company officials.

The exploitation could begin as of the next year

RMGC opinion is supported not only by the mayors of the 19 localities in the area where the mining project would be conducted, but also by MPs and members of the Government.

Thus, while PDL MP of Alba, Clement Negruţ, has expressed his hope that the project would be started next year, the Minister of Culture, Kelemen Hunor, contended that "a solution can be found so as not to compromise the cultural heritage, if a future exploitation is to be developed".

"In case of the Roşia Montană project, there will not be a political decision, but a purely technical one, to support the environment and culture. I will ask for environmental guarantees to the company which is to exploit in the area", Minister Laszlo Borbely mentioned in his turn.

Carnic Mountain, exploited after archaeological discharge

It is little probable, however, that the new urbanism certificate obtained by RMGC is able to

stop the exploitation, as the president of Alba County Council, Ion Dumitrel, has left to be understood.

"This document is totally different from the initial one. Objectives related to protecting the environment and historical patrimony are listed. All the questions asked by the specialists within the Ministry of Environment and the Ministry of Culture are detailed, while the answers are in the certificate", explained Dumitrel.

With regard to Carnic Mountain, one of the main reasons for the dispute between the civil society and the investors, this can be exploited if an archaeological discharge certificate is obtained.

DECISION

The European Parliament bans cyanides

The European Parliament adopted yesterday a resolution requesting the ban of cyanide technologies in mining in the EU by the end of 2011.

The resolution, which has no legal power, recommends the EU Commission and Member States not to support, "directly or indirectly, any mining project involving the use of cyanide technologies in EU, until the general ban is applied". The Resolution was adopted in the initial form agreed by the political groups, several amendments supported by the PDL delegation being rejected. **(Adrian Cochino)**

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
