Dear Honorable Minister Gondwe:

Please allow this to serve as the contracting vehicle between the Government of Malawi and my firm Nelson, Mullins Riley & Scarborough, LLP, referred to hereafter as Nelson Mullins. Per our discussion, this contract stipulates the terms under which Nelson Mullins will act on behalf of the Government of Malawi representing its interests in Washington, DC. I appreciate your consideration of this document and look forward to beginning our working relationship as soon as possible. Please be advised that when working with non-attorney personnel at Nelson Mullins, no attorney-client privilege exists.

While I have structured this contract to reflect the terms we discussed, it should be understood that at any time, our focus may need to shift depending on the circumstance, and rest assured that when we become part of your team, we will not shirk from needed actions when it can benefit the Government of Malawi. Among the tasks to be performed but not exclusively, are the following:

- 1). Introduce the President throughout the Halls of Congress to the Senators and Congressmen and Congresswomen that are most important to influencing policies favorable to Malawi. We will work to create a positive image for Malawi with the United States Government from both the Legislative and Executive branches.
- 2). Nelson Mullins will strive to help the donor community understand President Mutharika is a new President with a new plan to erase the sins of the past and to install a transparent government to be for the people of Malawi. President Mutharika will eradicate corruption

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from the government and seek to bring the donor community, and U.S. financial assistance, back to Malawi. Nelson Mullins understands that getting the donor dollars flowing to Malawi is of the utmost importance to the success of the new government.

3). With Presidential elections in the United States only two years away, Nelson Mullins will work to make sure the President has access to meet and build relationships with key candidates who are seeking that office. While it is too early for conjecture, Nelson Mullins has the ability and the connections to make introductions to all top named candidates who are on the horizon.

4). Nelson Mullins is the leading education policy organization in the United States, led by former Secretary of Education Richard Riley as a named partner. We will strive to help the President put his vision of establishing Community and Technical Colleges around the country as well as developing a strong educational system starting at the primary level.

5). Nelson Mullins will explore areas in which trade export quotas can be increased, especially for Malawi's largest export, tobacco. We will explore whether or not Malawi could fill the deficit of other countries that can't make their quotas. We will look at other potential trade export regulations to determine if there are areas to increase exports for Malawi's products.

6). Security of Malawi's borders are paramount. The issue with Tanzania is a growing concern. Now that oil has been found under Lake Malawi, Tanzania wants to challenge the border placement. Nelson Mullins will make this point to the appropriate people within the Administration and on Capitol Hill while seeking U.S. help in securing the Malawi borders.

7). Nelson Mullins understands that general economic help in the form of bringing investors into the country to invest in infrastructure, mining, and energy plants, could make a huge difference in the economy and welfare of the Malawi people. With great resources like coal, uranium, bauxite and now oil Malawi could become a self-sufficient country.

8). It is also imperative that elected officials in Malawi understand how Washington, DC and the United States Government operate, and to that end, we will be available to assist with this education of Statehouse officials about the best ways to maneuver the complex maze that is our government in an effort to achieve the goals set forth.

9). On the Public Relations side, Nelson Mullins will monitor national and international stories concerning the reputation and perception of Malawi. Additionally, we will push out the positive stories to various agencies to strategically create a perception that shows Malawi is changing and can become an example that the rest of Africa can follow. Malawi will be seen as a leader in change, progressive and transparent with the new President's leadership.

In consideration of the efforts of Nelson Mullins on behalf of the government of Malawi, that government shall pay Nelson Mullins a sum of \$30,000 a month each month for twelve (12) months commencing when the Firm receives the first payment and ending twelve (12) months

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from that date. Notwithstanding the date of execution of this Agreement, the Firm does not agree to act as a foreign agent on behalf of the Client, as such term is defined in the Foreign Agents Registration Act, and shall not act as a foreign agent on behalf of the Client, unless and until the Firm receives compensation from the Client. The full amount to be paid over that time is \$360,000 (USD). While Nelson Mullins would, under normal circumstance, charge twice this fee for the amount of work to be performed, I firmly believe the new President will be exactly what is needed to bring about real change and progress in Malawi. I look forward to being a part of this effort and as such, I am pleased to offer a reduced fee structure in the hope of establishing this relationship for the long term.

Expenses, such as travel to and from Malawi, if necessary shall also be the responsibility of the Government of Malawi. All necessary expenses will be documented and preapproved by the government prior to the expenses being incurred. I am hopeful this document accurately describes the manner in which we can begin our working relationship. I am pleased to answer any questions you may have, but in an effort to expedite our work on behalf of the Government of Malawi, you can sign below on the signature line to accept the terms as written. Upon receipt, I will execute for Nelson Mullins and provide you a copy for your records.
