LETTER OF AGREEMENT

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This agreement is made the first day of January 2009 by and between the Bermuda Ministry of Finance and/or Bermuda Stock Exchange (hereinafter referred to as MOF and BSX) and Marston Webb International (hereinafter referred to MWI).

In order to broaden and increase Bermuda's investor base and market recognition in the U.S. and abroad, MWI will provide the following services:

1. Consult with MOF and BSX management in all matters pertaining to investor related marketing and media strategy in the U.S. and in certain other countries or groupings of countries (including but not limited to the European Union, Latin and South America, Mid-East and Asia) as required.
2. Develop and implement various forms of IR, Public relations and other media outreach.
3. Assist MOF and BSX management in arranging investors' briefings and other meetings including individual or group presentations.
4. Create and distribute press releases and other forms of communication to the media, investors and advisory groups.
5. When practical, endeavor to arrange media interviews and encourage key journalists and newsletter publishers to follow Bermuda's story and in other ways, foster positive media attention and coverage on the inward investment opportunities that Bermuda and the BSX afford companies and investors in the U.S. and abroad.
6. Consult with management on inquiries and questions posed by institutional and private investors and the media.

7. Identify and maintain contact with prospective investors, fund managers, brokers, institutions and provide information regarding the inward investment opportunities which Bermuda and the BSX affords.
8. Advise management on conference, seminar participation and ensure that investors and/or media attending each event are made aware of Bermuda's presence in order to arrange meetings and/or interviews.
9. Provide direct mail facilities – including distribution of brochures, reports, newsletters, media coverage and reprints – to prospective investors, fund managers, brokers, investment advisory and money management groups and others in the U.S. and Canada.
10. Create and place advertisements for the MOF and/or BSX in various U.S. and international business and investor related publications as required.


For these services, MOF agrees to pay MWI a retainer fee of \$12,500 per month payable in advance. It is further agreed that all out-of-pocket expenses will be billed back to MOF and/or BSX at cost.

As part of the agreement, MWI undertakes to provide MOF with a quarterly report on its activities on behalf of MOF and the BSX. The first such report shall be due on or before 24 April 2009 for the quarter ending 31 March 2009.

This agreement shall be in effect until March 31, 2010, after which it may be renewed for a further period, or terminated by either party giving the other 90 days notice.

This agreement shall be governed by the laws of Bermuda.

Bermuda Signs Double Taxation Agreement With Qatar

HAMILTON, BERMUDA; MAY 15, 2012 – The Government of Bermuda and Qatar have signed a Double Taxation Agreement at a ceremony in Bermuda on Thursday, May 10. H.E. Paula A. Cox, JP, MP, Bermuda's Premier and Minister of Finance, signed for Bermuda while H.E. Moftha Jassim Al Mofthah, Director of Public Revenues and Taxes Department, Ministry of Economy and Finance, signed for Qatar. He was joined by Mr. Saeed Al Hejazi, Secretary of Tax Agreement Committee, Public Revenue and Tax Department, Ministry of Economy and Finance, Qatar.

In her remarks following the signing ceremony, Premier Cox said, the Agreement formalised a strong bond of friendship, commitment to mutual assistance in trade and cooperation in tax information exchange between the two countries. It was a government's strategy to position Bermuda to attract the Global Islamic financial services industry to the Island.

She reminded the audience that prior to becoming Premier, as Minister of Finance she had led a trade trip to Bahrain in 2010 as a key element of an initiative to promote a real engagement with the GCC region.

"My Government has, as a priority, the issue of jobs and being open for global business as we get Bermuda's economic recovery and stimulus actions on track by increasing opportunities with broader international markets. Today's ceremony marks another step forward in our aim to further Bermuda as a Western hub for the Islamic financial services industry."

"The Double Taxation Agreement (DTA) places Bermuda among Qatar's impressive network of 50 DTA's enabling us to market Bermuda as an interconnecting domicile for investment to and from those 50 countries," she said.

Premier Cox went on to say the agreement provides incentive to Qatar entities including Qatar Airways and Bermuda's reinsurance industry and shipping companies around the world that have Qatari or GCC ownership interests

A Memorandum of Understanding was also co-signed by the two countries covering economic, commercial and technical cooperation, including industry, mines energy, agriculture, communications, transportation, construction, labour and tourism. Qatar will assist Bermuda to make further inroads in the GCC region while Bermuda will position ourselves as a hub to access Western markets.

"I am pleased to advise that visits will be planned to look at potential joint venturing on development projects including tourism related opportunities," the Premier said.

"Qatar has been described as one of the world's richest countries having, in 2010, the world's highest GDP per capita while its economy grew by 19.40%, the fastest in the world. In a very real sense, our Agreement is an important handshake between Bermuda and the State of Qatar for Qatar is the hand in the GCC region and Bermuda could be described as the hook in the West. Qatar local folklore describes the shape of the country as resembling the palm of a right hand extended in prayer, while Bermuda is shaped like a fish hook. With Bermuda using our hook in the West to attract new business and with Qatar using its hand in the GCC to secure further opportunity, a powerful partnership has been formed for the benefit of the people of our respective countries," the Premier said.

Bermuda's Premier in Brussels for European Commission Meetings

Speaks to ABIR Regulatory Forum

HAMILTON, MAY 30, 2012 - The Hon. Paula A. Cox, J.P., M.P., Premier and Minister of Finance was in Brussels this week to deliver a clear message to key European decision-makers that Bermuda considers it vital to actively engage with Europe.

The Premier said it is important to put a political face on Bermuda while crucial decisions are being made. "We can afford to leave nothing to chance so the Government of Bermuda continues to work diligently to support the continued efforts of our independent regulatory authority, the Bermuda Monetary Authority and ABIR in strengthening the relations with the EU, both at the Member State level and among individual institutions," she said.

The Premier added: "It is crucial that the Government is visible in its support of the BMA and industry as Bermuda continues to press for formal recognition in its efforts to achieve equivalence. Although the gravity of the economic and financial issues dominates the Brussels agenda, there was real willingness and openness to meeting with me."

Bermuda's European advisor in Brussels, Mr. Alastair Sutton, accompanied the Premier in a series of one-on-one meetings which were not limited to discussion concerning equivalence but were to underscore Bermuda's commitment to closer strategic partnering with the European Commission policy-makers and regulators. "The aim is to aid growth of Bermuda's financial services sector and to share ideas as to how to enhance the relationship and means of fostering closer cooperation where there are opportunities to benefit Bermuda and Bermudians," she said.

The Premier said she met with Ms. Emer Daly, Director for the Governance of the Single Market in the Directorate General for Internal Markets and Services, and that the meeting provided an opportunity to update Ms. Daly on the equivalence discussions. "Given her wide remit it also afforded an opportunity to hear directly from her about the wider issues within Europe and was keen for me to share some of our legislation for information purposes."

At the meeting with Mr. Theo Saramandis, the Head of the OCT Task Force in the Directorate General for Development, the Premier discussed the framework for the EU relations with overseas territories which is being revised and reforms are taking place. "It presents an opportunity for Bermuda to consider how it wishes to engage and to assess the benefits for Bermudians. This was a very fruitful and productive exchange," she said.

Ms. Paulina Dejmek, the member of Commissioner Barnier's Cabinet, who is responsible for financial services in general and the Premier spoke frankly about the importance to Bermuda of the segmented approach relating to captive and insurance/reinsurance companies. "A one size fits all approach cannot be the appropriate model. I also indicated that I should be happy to have follow-up discussions on an ongoing basis with her on Bermuda-related issues," she said.

The Premier, who later delivered remarks at an ABIR hosted dinner on Tuesday evening, added that the EU business could be summed up as falling generally into the following three areas. Firstly, working to resolve the deficit crises in Greece and preventing contagion in other vulnerable Member States such as Spain and Portugal. Secondly, implementing measures to strengthen economic and financial governance in the EU. Lastly, discussing normal business such as external trade, aid and cooperation, competition, environment and climate change, green issues and the Single Market. "It was, in all, a most productive meeting," she said.
