In addition to the political activities outlined in #12, I will help to conduct a public relations campaign on behalf of Kazakhstan, and anticipate working with U.S. media outlets (reporters, columnists, and economic writers), with the ultimate goal of placing articles relevant to the repeal of the Jackson-Vanick restrictions placed on Kazakhstan. Additionally, I will be involved with coordinating a time for the media to participate in a private media tour of Kazakhstan to showcase Kazakhstan's improvement in human and democratic rights.

I will also work with American corporations working in Kazakhstan in a concerted effort to improve trade relations between the U.S. and Kazakhstan, and will work with others to schedule events and programs and also interact with think tanks, NGOs, and human rights communities to improve their perception of Kazakhstan.

Other projects I will play a role in include refining or establishing a new official Web site for Kazakhstan in the United States; establishing an official Kazakhstan blog; build a pro-Kazakhstan site; and building Kazakhstan's Web 2.0 presence through social media and outreach to online news sources and popular bloggers.

In conjunction with others at Policy Impact, I will work to improve the U.S. Kazak trade relations by endeavoring to have removed the certification language regarding the Republic of Kazakhstan from the FY 2010 Foreign Operations Appropriations Act by working with Senate and House members to build support for removing certification language regarding the Republic of Kazakhstan. I will also help demonstrate the benefits the United States will reap through the repeal of the Jackson-Vanick restrictions, and will expand this support by meeting and working with members of Congress.

Additionally, I will coordinate meetings with key members and staff of the Senate Finance and House Ways and Means Committee and the United States Trade Representatives (USTR) to advocate for Kazakhstan's accession to the World Trade Organization (WTO), and receipt of Most Favorable Nation (MFN). I will also seek to aid in establishing and growing the Central Asian Caucus, and will work with the Caucus to coordinate events, congressional delegations, and CoDels with and to Kazakhstan.

Further, I will work with Helsinki Commission members and staff to avoid undue criticism and negative commentaries from the Commission on Kazakhstan's democratic and human rights record, as well as with regards to its Chairmanship in the OSCE, in order to achieve a favorable review of Kazakhstan's progress in these areas.
