


Scope of Work: BGR PR will assist BGR Gabara with its work on behalf of the Embassy of Kazakhstan in London, United Kingdom. BGR PR will provide strategic public affairs services within the United States and will conduct outreach to relevant news outlets, individuals and entities as requested by the Embassy of Kazakhstan in London, United Kingdom.

Professional Fees and Terms: In consideration for BGR PR’s services and for work between January 12, 2010 and December 31, 2010, BGR Gabara agrees to pay BGR PR a monthly professional fee of US\$25,000.00. Either Party may terminate this Agreement for any reason upon forty-five (45) days written notice.

Renewal & Extension: This Agreement may be renewed and extended upon notice by either Party to the other and upon agreement of both, beyond the set termination date for a month-to-month basis commencing on the first day following the previous contractual termination date. Terms and Scope of Work will remain materially and substantively the same as before, unless otherwise agreed to by the parties in writing.


