Registrant is to be paid \$10,000/month (and reimbursed for expenses) by Principal from Sept. 1, 2010 for Registrant's consulting services as follows: advice on Principal's campaign for presidency of the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC), public relations, and US policies/politics; disseminate information on campaign and social/political/other issues in DRC; solicit/dispense money on behalf of principal for campaign and its activities; lobby US officials on issues of interest to DRC; plan/attend events and meetings with US officials, companies, et al.

7. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding.
Registrant will carry out the duties through its owner/CEO, Kimberly D. Reed, who will perform the agreed duties and tasks through personal meetings, telephone/internet/fax communications, written communications, research on-line and through other means (books, talking to professors and officials, et al). Ms. Reed will communicate on a several-times-a-day basis with the principal. Registrant will interview and recommend the hiring of campaign employees by the principal (but no additional employees/contractors will be hired by Registrant itself).

8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

Registrant is to perform these duties mostly in the US, but will also travel to Brussels, Belgium to meet with principal and his campaign team; other travel may be required outside the US. Registrant will create legal entity in the US for fundraising and performance of activities related to principal's campaign and will supervise any employees and volunteers of that entity; oversee world-wide campaign structures except inside DRC; work with Congolese expatriots to enable them to vote in presidential election and inform DRC citizens in DRC about principal's campaign and policies; arrange press interviews/stories and unpaid media; communicate with US government officials, companies and individuals about principal's campaign and policies; provide services and perform activities related to managing campaign.

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9. Will the activities on behalf of the above foreign principal include political activities as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act and in the footnote below? Yes No

If yes, describe all such political activities indicating, among other things, the relations, interests or policies to be influenced together with the means to be employed to achieve this purpose.

Registrant will work to make principal and his political campaign in DRC known to US officials charged with foreign policy and foreign aid policy; this will include personal meetings and other communications (written, telephone, email, etc.) with members of the US Senate and House of Representatives, their staffs and committee staffs. Registrant will do the same with respect to executive branch agency officials, particularly at the Department of State, Department of Defense, USAID, CIA, the Department of Commerce and the White House.

Registrant will also attempt to inform US officials of events occurring in DRC, particularly with respect to human rights violations, rape and murder of civilians, kidnapping of children by foreign military forces, theft and/or destruction of natural resources, and corruption in the DRC government, and will encourage them to adopt policies aimed at helping the people of the DRC to bring about democracy and rule of law through free and fair elections and other legal means. Registrant will provide information to these officials regarding attempts by the current regime in power in DRC to rig the 2011 presidential and legislative elections, suppress the vote in certain parts of the country, buy votes, persecute those who campaign against or show support of opposition parties or candidates, and prevent media outlets from freely disseminating information regarding opposition parties and candidates, and Registrant will encourage the officials to use the power and influence of the US government to pressure the current DRC regime to allow free and fair democratic elections.

Registrant will also provide information to US government officials and agencies regarding potential business and trade opportunities in DRC, if it were to have a stable and democratic government.
