It is financed through charitable contributions by foreign individuals and companies (in full compliance with Belgian law) and its charitable mission is to provide services to individuals and groups who have been victims of human rights violations in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC); accomplish projects in DRC that contribute positively to the lives of community members, e.g., schools, infrastructure projects, water wells, hospitals and medical equipment, et al.; provide information to Congolese individuals with respect to their legal rights (e.g., voting, filing criminal charges, etc.); and undertake other activities consistent with these charitable purposes.

It is financed through charitable contributions by foreign individuals and companies (in full compliance with Belgian law) who are concerned about atrocities and human rights violations being perpetrated in the Democratic Republic of Congo (DRC) and who want to help build democracy, infrastructure, education and other necessary institutions in DRC and help those who have been victims of human rights violations. Its finances are subsidized by Jean-Paul Moka, an individual with Belgian and Congolese citizenship, in compliance with Belgian law.

Registrant is to be paid a total of \$10,000/month (and reimbursed for expenses) by this Principal and another Principal (Jean-Paul Moka) from Sept. 1, 2010 for Registrant's consulting services: advice on charitable projects in Democratic Republic of Congo; creation and registration of a US branch of the Principal; finding office space for the Principal in Washington, DC; meet with US officials on issues of interest/activity of the Principal.

7. Describe fully the nature and method of performance of the above indicated agreement or understanding. Registrant will perform the agreement through its owner/CEO, Kimberly D. Reed, who will perform the agreed duties and tasks through personal meetings, telephone/internet/fax communications, research on-line and other means. Ms. Reed will communicate directly with the Principal's founder and board of directors chairman regarding its programs and its needs for her activities in the US. Registrant will interview and recommend the hiring of personnel of the Principal (but no additional employee/contractors will be hired by Registrant itself).

8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

Registrant is to perform these duties mostly in the US, but may travel to Brussels, Belgium to meet with the Principal's board of directors and founder. Registrant will create a nonprofit organization to serve as Principal's US branch and raise awareness of its activities in Congo. Registrant will serve as the US branch's interim executive director until a full-time executive director is hired.

9. Will the activities on behalf of the above foreign principal include political activities as defined in Section 1(o) of the Act and in the footnote below? Yes  No

If yes, describe all such political activities indicating, among other things, the relations, interests or policies to be influenced together with the means to be employed to achieve this purpose.

Registrant will meet with members of Congress, Executive Branch officials, their staffs, and other relevant persons/entities who are interested in or influential over US policy and aid in DRC, particularly with respect to health care, human rights, preventing violence against women, providing educational opportunities to Congolese youth, and building democracy and ensuring fair elections in DRC. This will include personal meetings and other communications (written, telephone, email, etc.) with the persons named above.

The purpose of these meetings will be to inform these parties of current events and developments in DRC and seek US assistance or support, particularly with respect to combating human rights violations, rape and murder of civilians, kidnapping of children by foreign military forces, theft and/or destruction of natural resources, and corruption in the DRC government.
