





Mr. Dow works closely with departments within the company's 10 brands to coordinate policies and positions on numerous industry issues.

Dear Tom:

This letter will confirm our agreement for you to transfer to Carnival Corporation in the position of Vice President-Public Affairs. This will become effective on the announcement of this position, which I would hope will be next week.

Your base compensation, which will become effective beginning with the new fiscal year, December 1, 2003, will be \$213,700. At the end of the year you will receive a bonus, which will be in the range of a minimum of \$50,000 to \$75,000, based on performance. You will also be awarded 12,000 stock options under the employee incentive stock option plan. Such an award will be made annually, and can vary, based on performance.

As a vice president of Carnival Corporation, you will also be part of the executive healthcare plan, and receive life insurance and disability benefits, as well as become part of our 401-K non-qualified deferred contribution plan.

You will report directly to me and to Micky Arison in your role as Vice President-Public Affairs. It's also understood, in that so much of your time will be spent in Washington, DC, that you and your family will move to Washington within approximately one year's time, but by no later than the end of 2004. At that time, you will receive a cost of living adjustment to your base compensation, given the higher cost of housing in the Washington DC area. All costs of the relocation to Washington, DC, will be borne by Carnival.

Micky and I very much look forward to working with you and know you will be very successful in your new and expanded responsibilities.
