




We are pleased to submit for your acceptance terms of a professional services agreement between the Colombian Foreign Investment and Export Promotion Agency (Proexport) and Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc.

1. Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. agrees to provide government affairs consulting to Proexport. The main purpose would be to work towards opening the US market and services to Colombia by seeking the approval of the United States-Colombia Trade Promotion Agreement ("The FTA"). Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. will follow the instructions from the Colombian Embassy as they execute their work towards this objective.
2. This agreement is effective April 13, 2011 through August 12, 2011. This agreement may be renewed or extended only upon mutual written agreement by both parties.
3. In consideration for professional services provided by Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc., Proexport agrees to pay to Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. Twenty Five Thousand US Dollars (\$25,000.00) per month with an administrative fee of Five Hundred US Dollars (\$500.00) per month.
4. Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. shall register and take whatever other actions may be necessary or appropriate under the laws of the federal government to fulfill its duties under this agreement.
5. All information provided by Proexport to Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. is confidential and proprietary to Proexport and shall not be disclosed to any third party by Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. without the prior written consent of Proexport.
6. Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. represents that there is no and will be no conflict of interest between its performance under this agreement and its engagement as an independent contractor by others. In the event that Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. believes that there may be a conflict of interest, Peck, Madigan, Jones & Stewart, Inc. will advise Proexport and the Colombian Embassy to the US, immediately.
