It will arrange business consulting, seminars, social events, and gatherings that help young businessmen and small & medium sized corporations better understand US market and enrich their entrepreneurship.


The activities will be mainly global market researching and helping small and medium sized corporations expand their businesses abroad by consulting and providing information.
