

The registrant will conduct outreach to key relevant U.S. officials, including Members of Congress, Commissioners, U.S. State Department and White House, to facilitate their participation in the conference; and to officials of other governments and international organizations, including the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe and the Organization for Islamic Cooperation; to representatives of non-governmental organizations; to relevant scholars; and to journalists.

The registrant will advise the principal on all aspects of the conference, including the agenda, speakers and topics, logistics, press, concluding document, etc., and will draft correspondence and other private and public materials as needed.

During the conference, the registrant will assist the principal and other contractors in running the events and in addressing all issues which may arise with the media, diplomatic corps, and non-governmental participants.



ENGAGING U.S. & INTERNATIONAL SECTORS
Proposal for Consulting Services

The October 15-16 International Conference on Anti-Semitism – in cooperation with Ukraine's OSCE Chairmanship – is an important next step in the progression of Ukraine-based outreach and impact.

As has been proven during the past 15 years and more, U.S. participation is critical to pushing for coordination among governments and results on the ground. It is both necessary and possible to attract senior and relevant Members of Congress, State Department officials, and representatives of federal commissions. Face-to-face conversations as to the nature and scope of the conference – and soliciting their input into the final agenda and scheduling – will both assure their attendance and build trust and deepen the partnership going forward.

MEETINGS: Immediate engagement in Washington will maximize the scheduling options for key participants, including those already planning international travel during the October 14-18 Congressional recess. Additionally, the White House may elect to organize an official U.S. Delegation that includes public members drawn from academia and communal leadership. Meetings with all likely officials will both assess their interest and availability, and sensitize them to the Ukraine angle in anti-Semitism efforts.

VISIBILITY: At the earliest possible opportunity, an op-ed in a Washington policy daily (Washington Post, Roll Call, The Hill), possibly co-authored by Oleksandr Feldman and Foreign Minister Kozachenko, could draw additional attention. Since Congress goes will recess for August by the end of this week, such an op-ed should either be placed immediately or during the second week of September.

LOGISTICS: Constant communication with individual participants, and coordination with government entities and NGOs, is indispensable to avoiding last-minute confusion and possible cancellations. On the ground during the event, having officials in the right place, with the right people and the right message is equally critical to building a brand and cementing long-term relationships. Most of the relevant officials will have their own travel budgets to pay their costs, but this requires significant documentation and approvals.

PROGRAM: Providing opportunities for U.S. officials to address the conference, as well as side meetings and follow-on events via the U.S. Embassy and others, will not only make a difference in fulfilling their experience but more importantly in maximizing the conference's outcome and momentum. This also means keeping close track of U.S. directions on the issue as the new season shapes up, so the substance of the conference is actionable and deliverable.
