**INSTRUCTIONS.** Each partner, officer, director, associate, employee, and agent of a registrant is required to file a short form registration statement unless he engages in no activities in furtherance of the interests of the registrant's foreign principal or unless the services he renders to the registrant are in a secretarial, clerical, or in a related or similar capacity. Compliance is accomplished by filing an electronic short form registration statement at <http://www.fara.gov>.

**Privacy Act Statement.** The filing of this document is required for the Foreign Agents Registration Act of 1938, as amended, 22 U.S.C. § 611 *et seq.*, for the purposes of registration under the Act and public disclosure. Provision of the information requested is mandatory, and failure to provide the information is subject to the penalty and enforcement provisions established in Section 8 of the Act. Every registration statement, short form registration statement, supplemental statement, exhibit, amendment, copy of informational materials or other document or information filed with the Attorney General under this Act is a public record open to public examination, inspection and copying during the posted business hours of the Registration Unit in Washington, DC. One copy of every such document, other than informational materials, is automatically provided to the Secretary of State pursuant to Section 6(b) of the Act, and copies of any and all documents are routinely made available to other agencies, departments and Congress pursuant to Section 6(c) of the Act. The Attorney General also transmits a semi-annual report to Congress on the administration of the Act which lists the names of all agents registered under the Act and the foreign principals they represent. 11. Patrick B. Hughes, an attorney with Adams Jones Law Firm, P.A., provides services to Dickens & Madson Canada, Inc. (Registrant 6200) including support in connection with Dickens & Madson's representation of the Libya HOR, and through its representatives. Mr. Hughes' role is expected to include lobbying/contact with the legislative and executive branches of the government of the United States and government agencies concerning Dickens & Madson Canada and its efforts on behalf of its client. Mr. Hughes is expected to be in contact with United States policy makers, opinion leaders and members of the press with respect to activities of Dickens & Madson's client. Mr. Hughes is expected to meet with representatives of Dickens & Madson's client and to attend, as an observer, meetings between representatives of Dickens & Madson's client and foreign governments. Mr. Hughes is further expected to provide consultation, negotiation and mediation services as necessary.
