



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

During 2013, Registrant engaged in informal discussions with Cabo-Verdean officials about assisting the country on matters of international trade and investment. Registrant was eventually put into contact with Mr. Frantz Tavares, President of Cabo Verde's Agency for Business Development and Innovation, who then put Registrant into contact with Dr. Humberto Santos de Brito, Cabo Verde's Minister of Tourism, Industry, and Energy, the department that handles international trade. Registrant and Messrs. Tavares and Brito agreed on a plan, through Skype conversations, in which Registrant is to provide advice and counsel to the Government of Cabo Verde on matters of international trade and investment.

8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

Registrant will provide assistance to the Government of Cabo Verde in some or all of the following manners: (1) advice and advocacy regarding the African Growth & Opportunity Act and other trade initiatives between or involving the United States and Cabo Verde; (2) advice and advocacy regarding World Trade Organization proceedings and developments; (3) advice and advocacy regarding regional trade issues, such as developments and opportunities relating to the Economic Community of West African States; and (4) advice and practical assistance to Cabo-Verdean producers and exporters.

Dear Frantz:

This e-mail confirms the agreement by which I will provide services to the Government of Cabo Verde. Specifically, we have agreed that I will serve as the country's special counsel on trade and investment issues, providing the following types of service:

1. Advice and advocacy regarding the African Growth & Opportunity Act and other trade and investment issues between the United States and Cabo Verde
2. Advice and advocacy regarding World Trade Organization developments and opportunities
3. Advice and advocacy regarding regional trade issues, such as developments and opportunities relating to the Economic Community of West African States
4. Advice and practical assistance to Cabo-Verdean producers and exporters

In return for this work, the Government of Cabo Verde will pay my law firm (Adduci, Mastriani & Schaumberg, LLP) \$7,000 per month, plus reimbursement for any expenses incurred as part of the representation. The agreement is valid through and including December 2014.
