Registrant will represent the interests of the foreign principal with the aim of promoting the proper implementation of the Compromise Peace Agreement signed in Addis Ababa, Ethiopia, on August 17, 2015. This process will include the reconstituting of the Government of South Sudan with the full participation of the SPLM-IO as well as other political parties and interest groups.

8. Describe fully the activities the registrant engages in or proposes to engage in on behalf of the above foreign principal.

The registrant will arrange meetings in Washington, D.C., and other U.S. cities for the foreign principal with policy makers (including Members of Congress and congressional staff members), Executive Branch officials, journalists, think-tank experts, academic specialists on Africa and peacemaking, business executives, and other individuals interested in South Sudan.

The registrant will, when called upon by the foreign principal, draft position papers, speeches, opinion articles, memoranda, and letters in support of the primary aims of the SPLM-IO.

The registrant will provide advice and counsel with regard to government affairs and public relations.




