ATTACHMENT A TO AMENDMENT TO REGISTRATION STATEMENT

From April 1, 2015 through September 30, 2015, the registrant performed the following activities on behalf of the foreign principal, Enewetak/Ujelang Local Government.

- Legal advice, based on review of the Compact of Free Association and related statutes, on the federal government's obligations with respect to the cleanup and resettlement of Enewetak.
- Legal advice to client on federal government's obligation to monitor a nuclear waste site under recent federal legislation.
- Legal advice to client on statutory procedures for obtaining disaster assistance in the wake of Tropical Storm Nangka.
- Review of the documents governing client's two trust funds; advice to client re same.
- Legal advice on how much client is allowed to withdraw from each trust fund, for what purposes under what circumstances, both under the statute and under the trust fund documents.
- Review of trust fund performance.
- Legal advice and assistance on procurement of food and fuel, including drafting procurement documents and advertisements.
- Legal advice on various issues, including disputes with equipment suppliers, etc.
- Review of loan documents.
- Review of real estate documents.
- Drafting resolutions of the Local Council and instructions to the trustee.
- Compiling performance progress reports for Food and Agriculture Program.
- Drafting performance plans.
- Work with College of the Marshall Islands (CMI) to establish a pearl farming operation in Enewetak.
- Work with CMI and Marshall Islands Conservation Society (MICS) on preparation of CMI grant application to support shore protection and other climate change mitigation in Enewetak.
- Work with MICS on grant application to a major private Japanese foundation for shore protection and other climate change mitigation in Enewetak.
- Consultation with experts from universities (including the University of Hawaii) and the private sector on economic development opportunities.
- Consultation with experts from universities (including Columbia University and the University of Hawaii) on possible sources of support for nuclear contamination and health issues.
- Communication with various U.S. and international universities (including the University of Southern California, UCLA, the University of Hawaii, and Southern Cross University) and private consultants to attempt to procure economic development study for Enewetak.
- Preparation of successful application to UCLA Applied Management Research program to arrange for economic development study for Enewetak; work with UCLA to plan and implement study.
- Research on various federal grants that client may be eligible to apply for in the future.

- Communication with Secretariat of the Pacific Community on obtaining sweet potato and other crops that are being made available for planting in the Pacific.
- Communication with University of Chicago and various libraries to obtain Enewetak genealogy prepared as part of a doctoral dissertation.
- Communication with staff from Office of Insular Affairs, Senate Energy Committee, Senate Appropriations Committee and House Resources Committee to obtain information only, i.e. to confirm that \$500,000 grant to support Enewetak Food and Agriculture Program had been included in the President's budget (prior to the registrant's engagement) and was not opposed by the relevant Congressional committees.
- Communication with Office of Insular Affairs officials to confirm that client was legally in compliance with terms and conditions of existing grants.
- Communication with Department of Energy officials to obtain information on their activities in furtherance of their pre-existing statutory obligations to monitor the nuclear waste site in Enewetak and the health of Enewetak residents.

NOTE: The registrant does not believe that any of the foregoing constituted "political activities" as that term is defined in Section 1(o) of the Foreign Agents Registration Act.
